DIGEST OF HB 1224 (Updated March 20, 2019 6:18 pm - DI 110)

Citations Affected: IC 5-2; IC 20-20.

Synopsis: School intergenerational safety pilot project. Establishes the school intergenerational safety pilot project (project) to foster positive youth development through intergenerational relationships between individuals who are at least 55 years of age and students and to improve school safety. Provides that the project expires July 1, 2021. Provides that a school corporation selected by the department of education is eligible to receive a grant from the Indiana safe schools fund to administer the project.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1224

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 5-2-10.1-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.25-2016,
2 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 2. (a) The Indiana safe schools fund is established
4 to do the following:

6 (A) use of dogs trained to detect drugs and illegal substances;

8 (B) purchase of other equipment and materials used to

11 (3) Provide matching grants to schools for school safe haven

 16 positive behavioral intervention and support, restorative

 21 (c) The institute shall determine grant recipients from the fund with
 22 a priority on awarding grants in the following order:

 24 (2) A safe haven grant requested under section 10 of this chapter.
 25 (3) A safe haven grant requested under section 7 of this chapter.
 26 (d) **Except as provided in subsection (e)**, upon recommendation of
 27 the council, the institute shall establish a method for determining the
 28 maximum amount a grant recipient may receive under this section.
 29 (e) **A school corporation selected to participate in the school
 30 intergenerational safety pilot project by the department under
 31 IC 20-20-46-5 is eligible to receive a grant from the fund in an
 32 amount described in IC 20-20-46-4 in addition to a grant requested
 33 by the school corporation under section 6 of this chapter.**
 34 SECTION 2. IC 20-20-46 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
 35 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 36 JULY 1, 2019]:
 37 **Chapter 46. School Intergenerational Safety Pilot Project**
 38 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "project" refers to the school**
 39 **intergenerational safety pilot project established by section 3 of**
 40 **this chapter.**
 41 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "project school corporation"**
 42 **refers to a school corporation that is selected by the department to**



1 participate in the project under section 5 of this chapter.

2 Sec. 3. (a) The school intergenerational safety pilot project is
3 established to foster positive youth development and school safety
4 through intergenerational relationships between senior citizens and
5 students.

6 (b) The project shall be developed and administered by the
7 department.

8 (c) A school corporation may participate in the project by
9 submitting an application to the department in a manner
10 prescribed by the department.

11 (d) A school corporation that participates in the project must
12 agree to:

13 (1) recruit not more than sixteen (16) volunteers who are at
14 least fifty-five (55) years of age to:

15 (A) patrol public school campuses to report situations
16 involving a threat to the safety of students or staff;

17 (B) mentor students through interaction with or by
18 presentations to the students;

19 (C) interact with and provide guidance for troubled youth
20 and, if necessary, report situations that may endanger the
21 health or safety of any student or staff member to a school
22 administrator; or

23 (D) provide assistance to teachers;

24 (2) require a volunteer described in subdivision (1) to obtain
25 an expanded criminal history and child protection index check
26 under IC 20-26-5-10; and

27 (3) commit to participate in the project for two (2) consecutive
28 school years.

29 Sec. 4. A school corporation that is accepted to participate in the
30 project by the department under section 5 of this chapter is eligible
31 to receive a seventy-five thousand dollar (\$75,000) grant from the
32 Indiana safe schools fund to administer the project and improve
33 school safety. A grant awarded under this section may be in
34 addition to a grant awarded to the school corporation under
35 IC 5-2-10.1-6 or IC 5-2-10.1-7.

36 Sec. 5. The department shall select not more than three (3)
37 school corporations to participate in the project. To the extent
38 possible, the department shall select project school corporations in
39 order to achieve geographic balance throughout Indiana and must
40 include one (1):

41 (1) urban;

42 (2) suburban; and



1 **(3) rural;**
2 **school corporation.**

3 **Sec. 6. Not later than December 1, 2020, the department shall**
4 **submit a report to the governor and, in an electronic format under**
5 **IC 5-14-6, to the legislative council summarizing the project and**
6 **may make recommendations for suggested legislative changes**
7 **regarding the project.**

8 **Sec. 7. This chapter expires July 1, 2021.**
