#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-34-4.5.

**Synopsis:** Opioid overdose reversal medication in schools. Sets forth certain requirements concerning naloxone nasal spray.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.
