

HOUSE BILL No. 1229

DIGEST OF HB 1229 (Updated February 1, 2021 12:15 pm - DI 77)

Citations Affected: IC 16-18; IC 16-21; IC 16-28.

Synopsis: Influenza immunizations. Requires hospitals to offer to administer an influenza immunization to hospital patients who are 65 years of age or older and are discharged from the hospital from October 1 through March 1, unless the immunization is contraindicated or is not available. Changes the date through which a health facility is required to administer or make available an influenza immunization from February 1 to March 1.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

HOUSE BILL No. 1229

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-223.7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.29-2009,

l 1	Sec. 1. This chapter applies to a hospital licensed under or

17	Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in section 3 of this chapter, if a



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patient who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older is discharged from a hospital during the period beginning October 1 and ending March 1 of the following year, the hospital shall, unless the immunization is medically contraindicated or the immunization is not available:

- (1) offer to administer to the patient; or
- (2) make available to be administered to the patient; immunizations against the influenza virus.
- (b) Immunizations provided under this chapter must be in accordance with the recommendations established by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices of the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that are in effect at the time the immunizations are provided.
- Sec. 3. A hospital is not required to provide or make available to the hospital's patients an annual immunization against the influenza virus if the state department determines that the necessary vaccine is not in adequate supply.
- Sec. 4. A hospital may not require a patient to receive an immunization.

SECTION 3. IC 16-28-14.5-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.29-2009, SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 3. A health facility shall annually administer or make available to be administered the immunizations required under this chapter to each employee of the health facility who is employed by the health facility during the period beginning October 1 and ending February March 1 of the following year.
