

HOUSE BILL No. 1233

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-19-7; IC 20-24.2-4-4; IC 20-25.7-4-8.

Synopsis: Green cleaning at schools. Requires the department of education (department), in consultation with the state department of health and the Indiana department of environmental management, to establish: (1) a list of environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products approved by the department; and (2) guidelines and specifications for the purchase, storage, and use of environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products by a school at a school facility. Requires, not later than July 1, 2022, the following: (1) A school to comply with the guidelines and specifications and notify school employees of the availability of the list and guidelines and specifications. (2) A school employee to use at a school only cleaning and maintenance products that are approved environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products and to comply with the guidelines and specifications. Allows the department to annually grant a green cleaning award to any school that complies with the guidelines and specifications before July 1, 2022. Requires the department to provide guidance and assistance to schools in complying with the green cleaning requirements.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

HOUSE BILL No. 1233

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-19-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2 A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2017]:
4 **Chapter 7. Green Cleaning at Schools**
5 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "environmentally sensitive**
6 **cleaning and maintenance products" means cleaning and**
7 **maintenance products that minimize adverse effects on children's**
8 **health and the environment.**
9 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "facility" means any school**
10 **building or school property used for instructional, athletic, or**
11 **recreational purposes.**
12 **Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "school" means:**
13 **(1) a public school;**
14 **(2) a charter school; or**
15 **(3) an eligible school (as defined in IC 20-51-1-4.7).**
16 **Sec. 4. (a) The department shall, in consultation with the state**
17 **department of health and the Indiana department of**

- 13 (1) provide a copy of the list and guidelines and specifications
- 14 described in this section at least once each year to the
- 15 superintendent of each school corporation; and
- 16 (2) post a copy of the list and guidelines and specifications
- 17 described in this section on the department's Internet web
- 18 site.
- 19 **Sec. 5. The department shall:**
- 20 (1) maintain a list of names and contact information of:
- 21 (A) persons that manufacture or offer for sale
- 22 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance
- 23 products approved by the department under section 4(a)
- 24 of this chapter; and
- 25 (B) contractors that provide services in compliance with
- 26 the guidelines and specifications established under section
- 27 4 of this chapter;
- 28 (2) upon request by a school, provide a copy of the list to the
- 29 school; and
- 30 (3) post a copy of the list on the department's Internet web
- 31 site.
- 32 **Sec. 6. The department may annually grant a green cleaning**
- 33 **award to any school that complies with the guidelines and**
- 34 **specifications established under this chapter before July 1, 2022.**
- 35 **Sec. 7. (a) Not later than July 1, 2022, a school shall:**
- 36 (1) comply with the guidelines and specifications established
- 37 by the department under this chapter; and
- 38 (2) notify school employees of the availability of the list and
- 39 guidelines and specifications described in section 4 of this
- 40 chapter.
- 41 (b) Not later than July 1, 2022, a school employee:
- 42 (1) may use at the school only cleaning and maintenance

4 **(2) shall comply with the guidelines and specifications**

6 **Sec. 8. The department shall provide guidance and assistance to**

8 **Sec. 9. The department shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to**
 9 **implement this chapter.**
