DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-21.8-5-1.

Synopsis: Massage therapist licensure by endorsement. Provides that a massage therapist who is licensed, certified, or registered in another state may receive an Indiana license by endorsement if the other state's credentialing standards are substantially equivalent to or exceed the credentialing standards in effect in Indiana at the time that the individual's license, certification, or registration was granted in the other state.

Effective: Upon passage.

HOUSE BILL No. 1235

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-21.8-5-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.267-2017,
2	SECTION 18, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 1. (a) The board may grant licensure by
4	endorsement to an individual who:
5	(1) is licensed, certified, or registered in another state having
6	credentialing standards that are substantially equivalent to or that
7	exceed the credentialing standards:
8	(A) specified under this article; or
9	(B) in effect in Indiana at the time that the individual's
10	license, certification, or registration was granted in the
11	other state;
12	(2) has no pending disciplinary actions in relation to the
13	performance of massage therapy and is in good standing with the
14	standards of the other state or country;
15	(3) pays an application fee established by the board;
16	(4) provides a history of the individual's criminal convictions, if
17	any, including any criminal convictions relating to the practice of



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1	the profession; and
2	(5) submits to a national criminal history background check as
3	prescribed by IC 25-0.5-1-9.
4	(b) The board shall deny an application for licensure if the
5	applicant:
6	(1) has been convicted of:
7	(A) prostitution;
8	(B) rape; or
9	(C) sexual misconduct; or
10	(2) is a registered sex offender.
11	(c) An applicant for licensure by endorsement shall cause each state
12	that previously credentialed the applicant to provide the board with the
13	applicant's current status in the state.
14	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
