## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1237**

DIGEST OF HB 1237 (Updated March 28, 2019 2:44 pm - DI 132)

Citations Affected: IC 9-13; IC 9-32.

**Synopsis:** Subscription auto sales. Extends the subscription program prohibition to May 1, 2020. Provides that effective July 1, 2013, a document preparation fee in excess of \$200 is an unfair practice. Specifies certain disclosure requirements concerning document preparation fees. Makes conforming amendments.

Effective: Upon passage; July 1, 2013 (retroactive).

## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1237

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-45.8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2013 (RETROACTIVE)]: Sec. 45.8. "Document preparation fee"
4	has the meaning set forth in IC 9-32-2-11.2.
5	SECTION 2. IC 9-32-2-11.2 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
6	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
7	1, 2013 (RETROACTIVE)]: Sec. 11.2. "Document preparation fee"
8	means any fee charged by a dealership concerning the sale of a
9	motor vehicle, regardless of designation, and that includes costs
10	incurred by the dealership for the preparation of documents
11	concerning the sale of motor vehicle. The term does not include a
12	fee imposed by a financial institution for the purpose of extending
13	credit for the purchase of a vehicle.
14	SECTION 3. IC 9-32-11-20, AS AMENDED BY P.L.112-2018,
15	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
16	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 20. (a) This section does not apply to:
17	(1) a manufacturer of a trailer or semitrailer; or



1 (2) a manufacturer that produces fewer than one thousand (1,000)2 units per year. 3 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a manufacturer or 4 distributor may not engage in sales directly to the general public in 5 Indiana. 6 (c) A manufacturer or distributor may engage in sales directly to the 7 general public in Indiana only if: 8 (1) the manufacturer or distributor was granted an initial license 9 to sell new motor vehicles before July 1, 2015; and 10 (2) the manufacturer or distributor establishes at least one (1) 11 physical location in Indiana that is a warranty repair service 12 center before January 1, 2018. 13 (d) A manufacturer or distributor described in subsection (c) must 14 stop engaging in sales directly to the general public in Indiana if the 15 manufacturer or distributor sells, transfers, or conveys a majority interest in the manufacturer or distributor to another person that is 16 17 required to be licensed under this chapter. 18 (e) For purposes of this subsection, "vehicle right of use 19 "subscription program" means a subscription service that, for a 20 recurring fee and for a limited period of time, allows a participating 21 person exclusive use of a motor vehicle owned by an entity that 22 controls or contracts with the subscription service. The term does not 23 include leases, short term motor vehicle rentals, or services that allow 24 short term sharing of a motor vehicle. Vehicle right of use Subscription 25 programs are prohibited in Indiana. This subsection expires on May 1, 26 <del>2019,</del> **2020.** 27 SECTION 4. IC 9-32-13-7, AS ADDED BY P.L.92-2013, 28 SECTION 78, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 29 JULY 1, 2013 (RETROACTIVE)]: Sec. 7. (a) Except as provided in 30 subsection (b), it is an unfair practice for a dealer to require a 31 purchaser of a motor vehicle as a condition of the sale and delivery of 32 the motor vehicle to pay a document preparation fee, unless the fee: 33 charge a document preparation fee in excess of two hundred 34 dollars (\$200). A document preparation fee under this section must 35 be: 36 (1) reflects expenses actually incurred for the preparation of 37 documents; 38 (2) was affirmatively disclosed by the dealer; 39 (3) was negotiated by the dealer and the purchaser; 40 (4) is not for the preparation, handling, or service of documents 41 that are incidental to the extension of credit; and 42 (5) is set forth on a buyer's order or similar agreement by a means



1	other than preprinting.
2	(1) included in the advertised sale price of a vehicle; and
3	(2) affirmatively disclosed:
4	(A) in writing by the dealer during negotiations for the sale
5	of a vehicle to a potential purchaser that states the dollar
6	amount of the document preparation fee to be charged;
7	and
8	(B) as a separate line item on the purchaser's bill of sale or
9	other purchase contract.
10	(b) A document preparation fee under this section may be
11	adjusted annually by a percentage equal to the annual percentage
12	change in the Consumer Price Index, as published by the United
13	States Bureau of Labor Statistics.
14	SECTION 5. An emergency is declared for this act.

Page 2, line 12, delete "A vehicle manufacturer or".

Page 2, line 13, delete "distributor may not use or enter into a subscription program.".

Page 2, between lines 14 and 15, begin a new paragraph and insert: "SECTION 2. IC 9-32-13-7, AS ADDED BY P.L.92-2013, SECTION 78, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

JULY 1, 2013 (RETROACTIVE)]: Sec. 7. It is an unfair practice for a dealer to require a purchaser of a motor vehicle as a condition of the sale and delivery of the motor vehicle to pay a document preparation fee in excess of two hundred dollars (\$200), unless the fee:

(1) reflects expenses actually incurred for the preparation of documents;



(2) was affirmatively disclosed by the dealer;

(3) was negotiated by the dealer and the purchaser;

(4) is not for the preparation, handling, or service of documents

that are incidental to the extension of credit; and

(5) is set forth on a buyer's order or similar agreement by a means other than preprinting.".

### SENATE MOTION

Madam President: I move that Engrossed House Bill 1237 be amended to read as follows:

Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-45.8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013 (RETROACTIVE)]: Sec. 45.8. "Document preparation fee" has the meaning set forth in IC 9-32-2-11.2.

SECTION 2. IC 9-32-2-11.2 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013 (RETROACTIVE)]: Sec. 11.2. "Document preparation fee" means any fee charged by a dealership concerning the sale of a motor vehicle, regardless of designation, and that includes costs incurred by the dealership for the preparation of documents concerning the sale of motor vehicle. The term does not include a fee imposed by a financial institution for the purpose of extending credit for the purchase of a vehicle.".

Page 2, delete lines 14 through 27, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 4. IC 9-32-13-7, AS ADDED BY P.L.92-2013, SECTION 78, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013 (RETROACTIVE)]: Sec. 7. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), it is an unfair practice for a dealer to require a



purchaser of a motor vehicle as a condition of the sale and delivery of the motor vehicle to pay a document preparation fee, unless the fee: charge a document preparation fee in excess of two hundred dollars (\$200). A document preparation fee under this section must be:

(1) reflects expenses actually incurred for the preparation of documents;

(2) was affirmatively disclosed by the dealer;

(3) was negotiated by the dealer and the purchaser;

(4) is not for the preparation, handling, or service of documents that are incidental to the extension of credit; and

(5) is set forth on a buyer's order or similar agreement by a means other than preprinting.

(1) included in the advertised sale price of a vehicle; and

(2) affirmatively disclosed:

(A) in writing by the dealer during negotiations for the sale of a vehicle to a potential purchaser that states the dollar amount of the document preparation fee to be charged; and

(B) as a separate line item on the purchaser's bill of sale or other purchase contract.

(b) A document preparation fee under this section may be adjusted annually by a percentage equal to the annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index, as published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics.".

Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
