Synopsis: Data base of valuable metal transactions. Creates the valuable metal dealers registry and data base. Establishes the valuable metal dealers registry and data base fund. Provides that the money in the fund is continually appropriated to the state police department.

HOUSE BILL No. 1240

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 10-13-9 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2016]:
4	Chapter 9. Valuable Metal Dealers Data Base
5	Sec. 1. After December 31, 2016, a person may not engage in the
6	business of purchasing and reselling valuable metal (as defined in
7	IC 25-37.5-1-1) without registering as a valuable metal dealer (as
8	defined in IC 25-37.5-1-1) with the superintendent of the
9	department in accordance with this chapter.
10	Sec. 2. The superintendent may issue, reissue, or deny
11	registration certificates to valuable metal dealers.
12	Sec. 3. To register as a valuable metal dealer with the
13	superintendent of the department, a person must do the following:
14	(1) Provide the following information in an electronic format
15	prescribed by the department:
16	(A) The name and street address of the valuable metal
17	dealer's place of business.



1 (B) The name of the primary owner of the business, and of 2 the manager of the business, if the manager is not the 3 primary owner. 4 (C) The electronic mail address of the business. 5 (D) Confirmation that the valuable metal dealer is able to 6 connect electronically with the department for the purpose 7 of sending and receiving information. 8 (E) Any other information required by the superintendent 9 of the department. 10 (2) Pay an initial registration fee of two hundred dollars 11 (\$200). 12 Sec. 4. A registration certificate issued to a valuable metal 13 dealer is valid for a period of one (1) year. A valuable metal dealer 14 may renew the registration certificate in the manner prescribed by 15 the superintendent of the department. The superintendent shall 16 charge a renewal fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) to cover 17 the costs of operating and maintaining the registry developed and 18 implemented under this chapter. 19 Sec. 5. A valuable metal dealer registered under this chapter 20 shall prominently display at the valuable metal dealer's place of 21 business a copy of the annual registration certificate received from 22 the superintendent of the department. 23 Sec. 6. Before January 1, 2018, the superintendent of the 24 department shall develop and implement a registry of valuable 25 metal dealers. The registry must be maintained as a secure data 26 base for use by law enforcement agencies that is capable of all the 27 following: 28 (1) Receiving and securely storing all the information 29 required by section 3 of this chapter and the transaction data 30 that valuable metal dealers are required to collect under 31 IC 25-37.5-1-2. 32 (2) Providing secure search capabilities to law enforcement 33 agencies for enforcement purposes. 34 (3) Making the electronic data collected under this chapter 35 and IC 25-37.5-1-2 available through an electronic searchable 36 format for individual law enforcement agencies and for 37 valuable metal dealers in Indiana. 38 (4) Providing, without charge, interlink programming to 39 enable the transfer of information to valuable metal dealers. 40 Sec. 7. A valuable metal dealer may search, modify, or update 41 only the valuable metal dealer's own business data contained 42 within the registry established under this chapter.



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Sec. 8. (a) The superintendent of the department shall use fees received under this chapter to develop and maintain the registry required under this chapter.

(b) The superintendent shall deposit the fees into the valuable metal dealers registry fund established by section 9 of this chapter. January 11 Sec. 9. (a) As used in this section, "fund" refers to the Ways and Means. valuable metal dealers registry fund established by subsection (b).

9 (b) The valuable metal dealers registry fund is established to
10 provide funds to administer this chapter. The department shall
11 administer the fund.

12 (c) Expenses of administering the fund must be paid from13 money in the fund.

14 (d) The fund consists of:

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(1) appropriations made by the general assembly; and

(2) fees collected under this chapter.

(e) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
manner as other public money may be invested. Interest that
accrues from these investments must be deposited in the fund.

(f) An amount necessary to administer this chapter is
 continually appropriated from the fund to the department.

23 (g) Money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year does not revert
24 to the state general fund.

Sec. 10. The superintendent may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2
 necessary to administer and enforce this chapter.
