## **HOUSE BILL No. 1240**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 12-7-2; IC 12-23-25.

**Synopsis:** Registration of recovery residences. Requires the operator of a recovery residence to register with the division of mental health and addiction (division). Sets forth the requirements for registration. Requires the division to: (1) establish a registration fee and a renewal fee; and (2) post a list of registered recovery residences on its website and include certain information concerning each recovery residence. Requires the division to adopt rules concerning: (1) the investigation of certain complaints; (2) the issuance, revocation, and denial of a registration; and (3) any rules necessary to implement these provisions. Allows the division to contract with a nonprofit organization that specializes in recovery residences to administer the registration of recovery residences.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

Chapter 25. Registration of Recovery Residences
Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "ethical standards" means the
ethical standards for recovery residences determined by any of the
following:
(1) The National Alliance for Recovery Residences (NARR).
(2) The Indiana Alliance for Recovery Residences.
(3) A similar organization, as determined by the division.
Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "operator" means a person that
operates a recovery residence.
Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "recovery residence services"
means residential care and supported housing for individuals with
chronic addiction provided in a recovery residence.
Sec. 4. An operator shall register with the division for the
purpose of ensuring adherence to ethical standards.
Sec. 5. (a) An operator applying for registration under this
chapter shall provide to the division the following:
(1) Information concerning the operator's:
(A) qualifications;
(B) work experience; and
(C) credentials for providing recovery residence services
or operating a recovery residence.
The operator must certify that the information provided
under this subdivision is correct.
(2) Three (3) letters of reference.
(3) A registration fee as set by the division.
(4) Proof that the operator is at least eighteen (18) years of
age.
(5) A statement that the operator will adhere to the ethical
standards.
(6) Any other information required by the division.
(b) A registration is valid for two (2) years. The operator may
renew the recovery residence's registration by updating any
information in the file that has changed and by paying the fee
required under subsection (a)(3).
Sec. 6. The division shall do the following:
(1) Establish the amount of the registration fee and renewal
fee under this chapter.
(2) Post a list of recovery residences registered under this
chapter to the division's website, including the following
information for each recovery residence:
(A) Name.

6	Sec. 7. An operator may not use the word "recovery residence"
7	in a title or description of a facility, organization, or program that

10	Sec. 8. The division shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2
11	concerning the following:
12	(1) The receipt, review, and investigation of complaints
13	concerning alleged violations of this chapter and alleged

15	(2) The issuance, revocation, and denial of a registration.
16	(3) Any other rules necessary to implement this chapter.
17	Sec. 9. An administrative proceeding under this chapter is
18	governed by IC 4-21.5.
19	Sec. 10. The division may contract with a nonprofit organization
20	that specializes in recovery residences to administer the
21	registration of recovery residences under this chapter, including
22	maintaining the list described in section 6 of this chapter.
23	Sec. 11. This chapter does not affect the standards for the
24	certification of recovery residences established under
25	IC 12-21-2-3(14).
