ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1243

DIGEST OF HB 1243 (Updated February 24, 2020 4:47 pm - DI 104)

Citations Affected: IC 25-17.3.

Synopsis: Genetic counselors. Amends the definition of "genetic counseling" for purposes of the genetic counselor licensing laws. Requires the genetic counselor master's degree training program to be accredited by the Accreditation Council for Genetic Counselors. (Current law requires accreditation by the American Board of Genetic Counseling.) Updates references to the American Board of Medical Genetics and Genomics. Amends requirements for a temporary license. Requires an applicant to complete the continuing education requirements of certain certifying organizations to renew a license. Provides that a genetic counselor may not be required to perform, participate in, or provide a service that violates any sincerely held ethical, moral, or religious belief held by the genetic counselor, and allows for a civil action for damages or reinstatement of employment for a violation. Repeals the law concerning education hardship waiver provision.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1243

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-17.3-2-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.177-2009,
2	SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1,2020]: Sec. 4. "Genetic counseling" means the communication
4	by an individual of any of the following: to
5	(1) Estimating, estimate, through the following methods, the
6	likelihood of the occurrence or recurrence of a birth defect or a
7	potentially inherited or genetically influenced condition:
8	(A) Obtaining and analyzing the health history of an individual
9	and the individual's family.
0	(B) Reviewing medical records.
1	(C) Evaluating the risks of exposure to possible mutagens or
2	teratogens.
3	(D) Recommending genetic testing or other evaluation to
4	detect fetal abnormalities or determine the carrier status of a
5	family member.
6	(2) Explaining to an individual or a family the following:
7	(A) The medical, psychological, and social implications of a

1	disorder and the usual course of evaluation, treatment, or
2	management.
3	(B) The genetic factors that contribute to the disorder and how
4	the genetic factors affect the chance for recurrence of the
5	condition in other family members.
6	(C) The available options for coping with, preventing, or
7	reducing the chance of occurrence or recurrence of the
8	disorder.
9	(D) The genetic or other tests available for inherited disorders.
10	(E) How to interpret complex genetic test results.
11	(1) Obtain and evaluate individual, family, and medical
12	histories to determine genetic risk for genetic and medical
13	conditions and diseases in a patient, the patient's children, and
14	other family members.
15	(2) Discuss the features, natural history, means of diagnosis,
16	genetic and environmental factors, and management of risk
17	for genetic and medical conditions and diseases.
18	(3) Identify, order, and coordinate genetic laboratory tests
19	and other diagnostic studies as appropriate for the genetic
20	assessment.
21	(4) Integrate genetic laboratory test results and other
22	diagnostic studies with personal and family medical history to
23	assess and communicate genetic risk factors.
24	(5) Explain the clinical implications of genetic laboratory
25	tests, other diagnostic studies, and the results.
26	(6) Evaluate the client's or family's responses to the condition
27	or risk of recurrence and provide client centered counseling
28	and anticipatory guidance.
29	(7) Identify and use community resources that provide
30	medical, educational, financial, and psychosocial support and
31	advocacy.
32	(8) Provide written documentation of medical, genetic, and
33	counseling information for families and health care
34	professionals.
35	SECTION 2. IC 25-17.3-4-1, AS ADDED BY P.L.177-2009,
36	SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
37	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 1. To qualify for licensure as a genetic counselor,

19	forth in section 1(4) of this chapter; and
20	(2) has an active candidate status for the certification.
21	(b) An individual who is issued a temporary license under this
22	section
23	(1) must apply for and take the next available examination for
24	certification; and
25	(2) may practice under the temporary license only if directly
26	supervised by a licensed genetic counselor or a physician licensed
27	under IC 25-22.5 under a genetic supervision contract.
28	(c) An individual who holds a temporary license issued under this
29	section and fails the examination for certification described in section
30	1(4) of this chapter for the first time may reapply for a second
31	temporary license. The board may not issue a temporary license to ar
32	individual who has failed the examination for certification more than
33	one (1) time.
34	(d) A temporary license issued under this section expires upon the

38	(2) The date that is thirty (30) days after the individual fails the

4	SECTION 4. IC 25-17.3-4-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.177-2009,
5	SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
6	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 4. The following individuals are not required to
7	be licensed under this article:
8	(1) An individual who is licensed as a physician under IC 25-22.5
9	or a nurse under IC 25-23. However, the individual may not use
10	the title "genetic counselor" or any other title that indicates that
11	the individual is a genetic counselor unless the individual is
12	licensed under this article.
13	(2) A student or an intern from an accredited school who is
14	participating in a supervised training program.
15	(3) An individual from another state who is certified by the
16	American Board of Medical Genetics and Genomics or the
17	American Board of Genetic Counseling or the successor of these
18	entities and acting in Indiana on a consultant basis.

21	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 6. (a) To renew a license under this article, an
22	applicant must complete continuing education The continuing
23	education must meet the requirements of IC 25-1-4 and consist of:

25	contact hours that have been approved by the National Society of
26	Genetic Counselors; or
27	(2) the successful completion in each two (2) year license cycle

(c) A civil action for damages or reinstatement of employment, or both, may be brought for any violation of this section.

SECTION 8. IC 25-17.3-5-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.177-2009, SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 3. (a) This section does not apply to section 2.5 of this chapter.

(b) A person who violates this chapter commits a Class A misdemeanor. In addition to any other penalty imposed for a violation of this chapter, the board may, in the name of the state of Indiana through the attorney general, petition a circuit or superior court to enjoin the person who is violating this chapter from practicing genetic counseling in violation of this chapter.

Madam President: I move that Engrossed House Bill 1243 be amended to read as follows:

Page 5, after line 9, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 7. IC 25-17.3-5-2.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: **Sec. 2.5. (a) Section 3 of this chapter does not apply to this section.**

- (b) A genetic counselor may not be required to:
 - (1) perform;
 - (2) participate in; or
 - (3) provide;

a service that violates any sincerely held ethical, moral, or religious belief held by the genetic counselor. An employer may not discriminate against or discipline a genetic counselor because of any sincerely held ethical, moral, or religious belief of the genetic

(c) A civil action for damages or reinstatement of employment, or both, may be brought for any violation of this section.

SECTION 8. IC 25-17.3-5-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.177-2009, SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 3. (a) This section does not apply to section 2.5 of this chapter.

(b) A person who violates this chapter commits a Class A misdemeanor. In addition to any other penalty imposed for a violation of this chapter, the board may, in the name of the state of Indiana through the attorney general, petition a circuit or superior court to enjoin the person who is violating this chapter from practicing genetic counseling in violation of this chapter."
