## **HOUSE BILL No. 1245**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 14-8-2; IC 14-13-10.

Synopsis: Pigeon Creek. Defines "Pigeon Creek basin" as the area in Gibson County, Vanderburgh County, and Warrick County that is drained by Pigeon Creek. Establishes the Pigeon Creek commission (commission) as a public body corporate and politic composed of the following voting members: (1) The director of the department of natural resources or the director's designee. (2) Two representatives appointed by the county executive of each county in the basin. Allows the county executive of Pike County to appoint one individual to serve as a nonvoting member of the commission. Authorizes the commission to implement certain activities related to flood control, drainage, public use, public safety, and wildlife management within the channels of Pigeon Creek and within the area extending 75 feet from the top of each bank of the creek. Allows the commission to establish advisory committees to the commission.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "Pigeon Creek basin" means the

3	Sec. 4. The Pigeon Creek commission is established as a public
4	body corporate and politic.
5	Sec. 5. The exercise of the powers granted by this chapter is for
6	the benefit of the people of Indiana and for the increase of their
7	commerce, health, enjoyment, and prosperity. The operation,
8	creation, development, and maintenance of the projects by the
9	commission constitute the performance of essential governmental
10	functions.
11	Sec. 6. The commission shall limit the commission's activities to
12	the Pigeon Creek basin.
13	Sec. 7. (a) The commission consists of the following individuals:
14	(1) The director, or the director's designee, who is a voting
15	member.
16	(2) Two (2) representatives appointed by the county executive
17	of each county in the basin, each of whom is a voting member.
18	(b) In addition to the members described in subsection (a), the
19	county executive of Pike County may appoint one (1) individual to
20	serve as a nonvoting member of the commission.
21	(c) A member appointed under subsection (a)(2) must reside in
22	the county within the basin for which the member is appointed.
23	Sec. 8. Each member of the commission appointed under section
24	7(a)(2) of this chapter must have a background in:

31	Sec. 9. The term of office of a member of the commission is four

20	(1) A majority of voting members constitutes a quorum.

27	(b) The commission may adopt additional rules for the

29	Sec. 14. (a) Each commission member is entitled to
30	reimbursement for traveling and other expenses as provided in the
31	state travel policies and procedures established by the Indiana
32	department of administration and approved by the budget agency.
33	(b) Each appointed commission member is entitled to the
34	minimum salary per diem set by the commission and approved by
35	the fiscal body of each county in the basin. However, if an
36	appointed commission member is also a local elected official, the
37	member is not entitled to a payment from the commission of the
38	minimum salary per diem established under this subsection.
39	Sec. 15. (a) The commission:
10	(1) shall develop a plan regarding:
11	(A) flood control;
12	(B) drainage;

2	(D) public safety; and
3	(E) wildlife management;
4	within the basin;
5	(2) shall, after June 30, 2020, have exclusive authority to
6	implement the activities described in subdivision (1) within

8	seventy-five (75) feet from the top of each bank of the creek.
9	(3) shall consider opportunities for economic development
0	within the basin; and
11	(4) may acquire interests in land, including easements, for the
12	commission's use in providing flood storage.
13	(b) The commission does not have the authority to exercise the
14	power of eminent domain. However, after other attempts to
15	acquire property or a property interest have failed, the commission
16	shall determine the necessity of acquiring by eminent domain any
17	property or property interest that is necessary for the
18	implementation of the commission's powers under this chapter. It
19	the commission determines that it is necessary to initiate ar
20	eminent domain proceeding, the commission shall refer a reques
21	to initiate the eminent domain proceeding to the county executive
22	of the county where the property is located. The county executive
23	has ninety (90) days after receiving the request from the
24	commission to approve or deny a request to initiate an eminen
25	domain proceeding for a proposed property or property interest
26	(c) The commission's exclusive authority to implement activities
27	under subsection (a)(2) includes the authority to do or undertake
28	the following:
29	(1) Bank stabilization.
30	(2) Tree removal.
31	(3) Channel reconstruction.
32	(4) Sediment removal.
33	(5) Acquire, construct, and maintain access roads to levees
34	and the channel of the creek.
35	(6) Other actions considered necessary by the commission to
36	carry out this chapter.
37	(d) A county must first obtain authorization of the commission
38	before performing any work within the area described in
39 10	subsection (a)(2), unless the county must perform the work in
10 11	response to an emergency (as defined in IC 36-1-2-4.5).
11	Sec. 16. The commission may do the following:



(1) Conduct all studies necessary for the performance of the

1	commission's duties.
2	(2) Publicize, advertise, and distribute reports on the
3	commission's purposes, objectives, and findings.
4	(3) When requested, provide recommendations in matters
5	related to the commission's functions and objectives to the
6	following:
7	(A) Political subdivisions in the basin.
8	(B) Other public and private agencies.
9	(4) When requested, act as a coordinating agency for
10	programs and activities of other public and private agencies
11	that are related to the commission's objectives.
12	Sec. 17. (a) The commission may receive grants and
13	appropriations from the following:
14	(1) Federal, state, and local governments.
15	(2) Individuals, foundations, and other organizations.
16	(b) The commission may enter into agreements or contracts
17	regarding the acceptance or use of these grants and appropriations
18	for the purpose of carrying out the commission's activities under
19	this chapter.
20	(c) The commission must expend money appropriated to the
21	commission for the purpose for which the money is appropriated.
22	Sec. 18. (a) The commission may:
23	(1) acquire and dispose of real or personal property by grant,
24	gift, purchase, lease, devise, or otherwise; and
25	(2) hold, use, improve, maintain, operate, own, manage, or
26	lease as lessor or lessee real or personal property or any
27	interest in that property;
28	for the purposes prescribed by this chapter.
29	(b) The commission may exercise the powers granted by this
30	section for the development of the water resources of the basin.
31	Sec. 19. The commission may sue and be sued.
32	Sec. 20. (a) The commission may establish an advisory
33	committee. If the commission establishes an advisory committee
34	under this subsection, the advisory committee shall consist of:
35	(1) the south-southwest regional director of the Indiana
36	Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts;
37	(2) the county surveyor of each Indiana county within the
38	basin; and
39	(3) one (1) member from the largest municipality located
40	within the basin.
41	However, a county surveyor may not be a member of the advisory

committee if the county surveyor represents the county on the



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1	commission. The county executive of a county represented on the
2	commission by the county surveyor shall appoint an individual
3	other than the county surveyor to represent the county on the
4	advisory committee.
5	(b) Subsection (a) may not be construed to prohibit the
6	commission from appointing other advisory committees consisting
7	of individuals whose experience, training, or interest in the
8	program enables the individuals to assist the commission.
9	(c) A member of an advisory committee is not entitled to
10	compensation for the member's services.
11	Sec. 21. (a) Each county in the basin may budget, appropriate,
12	and disburse money to carry out the purposes of the commission
13	under this chapter. The amount of the appropriation from each
14	county may be apportioned among the counties in the basin in
15	direct relationship to the amount of land area lying within the
16	basin boundaries.
17	(b) The department shall certify the boundaries and the
18	drainage area of each county within the basin after consultation
19	with the respective county surveyors before submission of budgets
20	to the appropriating bodies so that the correct amount can be
21	appropriated.
22	(c) The commission may hire the support staff necessary for the
23	commission.
24	Sec. 22. (a) The commission shall do the following:
25	(1) Prepare and adopt by majority vote in accordance with
26	section 13 of this chapter an annual budget.
27	(2) Submit the budget to each county, municipality, or agency
28	appropriating money for the use of the commission.
29	(b) After approval of the budget by the commission, money may
30	be expended only as budgeted unless a majority vote of the
31	commission authorizes other expenditures.
32	(c) Any appropriated amounts remaining unexpended or
33	unencumbered at the end of the year become part of a
34	nonreverting cumulative fund to be held in the name of the
35	commission. The commission may authorize unbudgeted
36	expenditures from this fund by a majority vote of the commission.
37	(d) The commission is responsible for the safekeeping and
38	deposit of money the commission receives under this chapter. The
39	state board of accounts shall:
40	(1) prescribe the methods and forms for keeping; and
41	(2) periodically audit;

the accounts, records, and books of the commission.
