HOUSE BILL No. 1248

DIGEST OF HB 1248 (Updated February 12, 2015 11:14 am - DI 77)

Citations Affected: IC 15-11.

Synopsis: Urban farming. Requires the state department of agriculture to develop and promote programs in support of urban farming, food cooperatives, and farmers' markets. Establishes the local farm and food council (council) to study certain topics concerning the growth of an Indiana based local farm and food product economy and make recommendations to the department of agriculture (department). Allows the department to implement the council's recommendations. Establishes the Indiana farm and food fund. Establishes a farm commodities and market news service, including a pilot program, within the department, to be funded from the livestock industry promotion and development fund.

HOUSE BILL No. 1248

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning agriculture and animals and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 15-11-2-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.25-2014, 2 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 3 JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 6. (a) The general assembly declares that it is the 4 policy of the state to conserve, protect, and encourage the development and improvement of agriculture, agricultural businesses, and 6 agricultural land for the production of food, fuel, fiber, and other agricultural products. The Indiana Code shall be construed to protect 8 the rights of farmers to choose among all generally accepted farming and livestock production practices, including the use of ever changing 10 technology.

11 (b) The department shall promote the growth of agricultural 12 businesses by doing the following:

(1) Assisting agricultural businesses with the permit process required to conduct business in Indiana.
