## **HOUSE BILL No. 1250**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 21-44-5-19.

**Synopsis:** Implicit bias in medicine. Requires the medical education board to establish an education program for first year medical students that addresses implicit bias in the delivery of health care services to different racial and ethnic minority groups in Indiana.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1250**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 21-44-5-19 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2020]: Sec. 19. (a) As used in this section, "implicit bias" means
4	stereotypes and attitudes that unconsciously affect a person's
5	understanding, decisions, and actions.
6	(b) The board shall establish an education program for first
7	year medical students that addresses implicit bias in the delivery
8	of health care services to different racial and ethnic minority
9	groups in Indiana.
10	(c) The education program established under subsection (b)
11	must include the following:
12	(1) Examples of implicit bias in the delivery of health care
13	services, including the effect on prescribing medications and
14	ordering specific treatments.
15	(2) Effective skills to avoid implicit bias.
16	(d) The education program required under this section must be
17	implemented not later than July 1, 2021.
