**Synopsis:** Interim study on implicit bias in medicine. Urges the legislative council to assign to an appropriate interim study committee the topic of implicit bias in the delivery of health care services to different racial and ethnic minority groups in Indiana.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

9	(2) Initiatives that assist in identifying and avoiding implicit
10	bias described in subdivision (1).
11	(c) This SECTION expires January 1, 2021.
12	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
