A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) As used in this
2	SECTION, "legislative council" refers to the legislative council
3	created by IC 2-5-1.1-1.
4	(b) As used in this SECTION, "study committee" means either
5	of the following:
6	(1) A statutory committee established under IC 2-5.
7	(2) An interim study committee.
8	(c) The legislative council is urged to assign to the appropriate
9	study committee during the 2021 interim the task of studying
10	Indiana's trauma care system, including the following:
11	(1) Explore Indiana's current system versus other state
12	trauma models that include prehospital, hospital, and
13	rehabilitation care.
14	(2) Review the American College of Surgeons
15	recommendations for trauma systems.
16	(3) How Indiana should formalize a state trauma care system.
17	(4) The appropriate communication among the multiple
18	emergency medical services providers and whether the



1	current levels of communication are adequate.
2	(5) Review jurisdictional oversight with specific focus on rural
3	communities.
4	(6) Determine any funding mechanisms that are necessary for
5	support of an optimal trauma system.
6	(d) If an appropriate study committee is assigned the topics
7	described under subsection (c), the study committee shall issue to
8	the legislative council a final report containing the study
9	committee's findings and recommendations, including any
10	recommended legislation concerning the topics, in an electronic
11	format under IC 5-14-6 not later than November 1, 2021.
12	(e) This SECTION expires December 31, 2021.
13	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
