# HOUSE BILL No. 1263

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-1-9.5.

**Synopsis:** Prescriptions and telemedicine. Sets forth requirements that must be met before a prescriber may prescribe medicine to a patient receiving telemedicine services.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

### HOUSE BILL No. 1263

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-1-9.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

4	<b>Chapter 9.5. Telemedicine Services and Prescriptions</b>
5	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "prescriber" means any of the
6	following:
7	(1) A physician licensed under IC 25-22.5.
8	(2) A physician assistant licensed under IC 25-27.5 and
9	granted the authority to prescribe by the physician assistant's
10	supervisory physician in accordance with IC 25-27.5-5-4.
11	(3) An advanced practice nurse licensed and granted the
12	authority to prescribe drugs under IC 25-23.
13	Sec. 2. (a) As used in this chapter, "telemedicine" means the
14	delivery of health care services using electronic communications
15	and information technology, including:
16	(1) secure videoconferencing; and
17	(2) interactive audio-using store and forward technology;

9	Sec. 3. (a) A prescriber may issue a prescription to a patient who
10	is receiving services through the use of telemedicine even if the
11	patient has not been seen previously by the prescriber in person if
12	the following conditions are met:
13	(1) The prescriber has done the following:
14	(A) Established a provider-patient relationship with the
15	patient.
16	(B) Satisfied the applicable standard of care in the
17	treatment of the patient.
18	(C) Generated and maintained a medical record for the
19	patient that indicates the prescription being prescribed.
20	(2) The issuance of the prescription by the provider is:
21	(A) within the prescriber's scope of practice and
22	certification; and
23	(B) in accordance with any applicable law or rule.
24	(3) The prescription is not for a controlled substance (as
25	defined in IC 35-48-1-9).
26	(b) To the extent a rule conflicts with this chapter, this chapter
27	is controlling.
