

# HOUSE BILL No. 1274

---

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 9-13-2; IC 9-19; IC 20-20-41; IC 20-27.

**Synopsis:** Lap and shoulder safety belts on school buses. Provides that a school bus or special purpose bus: (1) that is first placed into operation after June 30, 2015, and that is used to transport elementary school or high school students must be equipped with a 3-point lap and shoulder safety belt (safety belt) at each seating location; and (2) after June 30, 2019, must be equipped with a safety belt at each seating location. Requires the state school bus committee to adopt rules for the design, installation, and use of safety belt systems that must be installed in school buses and special purpose buses. Provides for an exception to the laws concerning other types of passenger restraint systems. Requires each occupant of a school bus or special purpose bus first placed into operation after June 30, 2015, to have the safety belt properly fastened about the occupant's body at all times when the bus is in motion. Establishes the safety belt revolving loan fund (fund). Requires the department of education to establish a revolving loan program to provide loans from the fund to school corporations to assist school corporations in paying expenses necessary to comply with requirements concerning safety belts on school buses and special purpose buses. Appropriates \$10,000,000 to the fund from the state general fund. Makes conforming amendments.

## HOUSE BILL No. 1274

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles and to make an appropriation.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-112.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: **Sec. 112.5. "Nonpublic school" has the**  
4 **meaning set forth in IC 20-18-2-12.**

5 SECTION 2. IC 9-13-2-161, AS AMENDED BY P.L.146-2009,  
6 SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
7 JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 161. (a) "School bus" means, except as provided  
8 in subsections (b), ~~and~~ (c), **and (d)**, a:

- 9 (1) bus;  
10 (2) hack;  
11 (3) conveyance;  
12 (4) commercial motor vehicle; or  
13 (5) motor vehicle;

14 used to transport preschool, elementary, or secondary school children  
15 to and from school and to and from school athletic games or contests  
16 or other school functions. The term does not include a privately owned



1 automobile with a capacity of not more than five (5) passengers that is  
2 used for the purpose of transporting school children to and from school.

3 (b) "School bus", for purposes of IC 9-21, means a motor vehicle  
4 owned by a public or governmental agency and operated for the  
5 transportation of children to or from school, including project  
6 headstart, or privately owned and operated for compensation for the  
7 transportation of children to and from school, including project  
8 headstart.

9 (c) "School bus", for purposes of IC 9-19-11-1(1), means a motor  
10 vehicle:

11 (1) that meets the federal school bus safety requirements under 49  
12 U.S.C. 30125; or

13 (2) that meets the federal school bus safety requirements under 49  
14 U.S.C. 30125 except the:

15 (A) stop signal arm required under federal motor vehicle  
16 safety standard (FMVSS) no. 131; and

17 (B) flashing lamps required under federal motor vehicle safety  
18 standard (FMVSS) no. 108.

19 (d) "School bus", for purposes of IC 9-19, except as provided in  
20 subsection (c), means a:

21 (1) bus;

22 (2) hack;

23 (3) conveyance;

24 (4) commercial motor vehicle; or

25 (5) motor vehicle;

26 used to transport elementary school (as defined in IC 20-18-2-4) or  
27 high school (as defined in IC 20-18-2-7) students, or students in any  
28 combination of grades included in IC 20-18-2-4 and IC 20-18-2-7,  
29 to and from school and to and from school athletic games or  
30 contests or other school functions. The term does not include a  
31 privately owned automobile with a capacity of not more than five  
32 (5) passengers that is used for the purpose of transporting school  
33 children to and from school.

34 SECTION 3. IC 9-13-2-170.7, AS ADDED BY P.L.107-2006,  
35 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
36 JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 170.7. (a) "Special purpose bus" has the meaning  
37 set forth in IC 20-27-2-10. means, except as provided in subsection  
38 (b), a motor vehicle:

39 (1) that is designed and constructed for the accommodation of  
40 more than ten (10) passengers;

41 (2) that:

42 (A) meets the federal school bus safety requirements under

 22           **more than ten (10) passengers;**  
 23           **(2) that:**  
 24           **(A) meets the federal school bus safety requirements under**  
 25           **49 U.S.C. 30125 except the:**  
 26           **(i) stop signal arm required under federal motor vehicle**  
 27           **safety standard (FMVSS) no. 131; and**  
 28           **(ii) flashing lamps required under federal motor vehicle**  
 29           **safety standard (FMVSS) no. 108;**  
 30           **(B) when used to transport students, complies with the**  
 31           **Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations as prescribed by**  
 32           **the United States Department of Transportation Federal**  
 33           **Motor Carrier Safety Administration as set forth in 49**

 35           **(C) when used to transport students, is a motor coach type**  
 36           **bus with a capacity of at least thirty (30) passengers and a**  
 37           **gross vehicle weight rating greater than twenty-six**  
 38           **thousand (26,000) pounds; and**  
 39           **(3) that is used by a school corporation or a nonpublic school**  
 40           **for transportation purposes.**  
 41           SECTION 4. IC 9-19-10-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.214-2007,  
 42           SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE



1 JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 1. This chapter does not apply to an occupant of  
 2 a motor vehicle who meets any of the following conditions:

3 (1) For medical reasons should not wear safety belts, provided the  
 4 occupant has written documentation of the medical reasons from  
 5 a physician.

6 (2) Is a child required to be restrained by a child restraint system  
 7 under IC 9-19-11 **or a 3-point lap and shoulder safety belt**  
 8 **under IC 9-19-13.**

9 (3) Is traveling in a commercial or a United States Postal Service  
 10 vehicle that makes frequent stops for the purpose of pickup or  
 11 delivery of goods or services.

12 (4) Is a rural carrier of the United States Postal Service and is  
 13 operating a vehicle while serving a rural postal route.

14 (5) Is a newspaper motor route carrier or newspaper bundle hauler  
 15 who stops to make deliveries from a vehicle.

16 (6) Is a driver examiner designated and appointed under  
 17 IC 9-14-2-3 and is conducting an examination of an applicant for  
 18 a permit or license under IC 9-24-10.

19 (7) Is an occupant of a farm truck being used on a farm in  
 20 connection with agricultural pursuits that are usual and normal to  
 21 the farming operation, as set forth in IC 9-29-5-13(b)(2).

22 (8) Is an occupant of a motor vehicle participating in a parade.

23 (9) Is an occupant of the living quarters area of a recreational  
 24 vehicle.

25 (10) Is an occupant of the treatment area of an ambulance (as  
 26 defined in IC 16-18-2-13).

27 (11) Is an occupant of the sleeping area of a tractor.

28 (12) Is an occupant other than the operator of a vehicle described  
 29 in IC 9-20-11-1(1).

30 (13) Is an occupant other than the operator of a truck on a  
 31 construction site.

32 (14) Is a passenger other than the operator in a cab of a Class A  
 33 recovery vehicle or a Class B recovery vehicle who is being  
 34 transported in the cab because the motor vehicle of the passenger  
 35 is being towed by the recovery vehicle.

36 (15) Is an occupant other than the operator of a motor vehicle  
 37 being used by a public utility in an emergency as set forth in  
 38 IC 9-20-6-5.

39 SECTION 5. IC 9-19-11-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.24-2006,  
 40 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
 41 JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 1. This chapter does not apply to a person who  
 42 operates any of the following vehicles:



- 1 (1) A school bus **or a special purpose bus.**  
 2 (2) A taxicab.  
 3 (3) An ambulance.  
 4 (4) A public passenger bus.  
 5 (5) A motor vehicle having a seating capacity greater than nine  
 6 (9) individuals that is owned or leased and operated by a religious  
 7 or not-for-profit youth organization.  
 8 (6) An antique motor vehicle.  
 9 (7) A motorcycle.  
 10 (8) A motor vehicle that is owned or leased by a governmental  
 11 unit and is being used in the performance of official law  
 12 enforcement duties.  
 13 (9) A motor vehicle that is being used in an emergency.  
 14 (10) A motor vehicle that is funeral equipment used in the  
 15 operation of funeral services when used in:  
 16 (A) a funeral procession;  
 17 (B) the return trip to a funeral home (as defined in  
 18 IC 25-15-2-15); or  
 19 (C) both the funeral procession and return trip.

20 SECTION 6. IC 9-19-13-3.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
 21 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
 22 1, 2014]: **Sec. 3.5. (a) A school bus or special purpose bus that is**  
 23 **first placed into operation after June 30, 2015, and that is used to**  
 24 **transport elementary school (as defined in IC 20-18-2-4) or high**  
 25 **school (as defined in IC 20-18-2-7) students, or students in any**  
 26 **combination of grades included in IC 20-18-2-4 and IC 20-18-2-7,**  
 27 **must be equipped with a 3-point lap and shoulder safety belt at**  
 28 **each seating location. The safety belt installation and safety belt**  
 29 **and anchor must meet the specifications of the Society of**  
 30 **Automotive Engineers.**

31 **(b) After June 30, 2019, a school bus or special purpose bus that**  
 32 **is used to transport elementary school (as defined in IC 20-18-2-4)**  
 33 **or high school (as defined in IC 20-18-2-7) students, or students in**  
 34 **any combination of grades included in IC 20-18-2-4 and**  
 35 **IC 20-18-2-7, must be equipped with a 3-point lap and shoulder**  
 36 **safety belt at each seating location. The safety belt installation and**  
 37 **safety belt and anchor must meet the specifications of the Society**  
 38 **of Automotive Engineers.**

39 **(c) A school corporation or a nonpublic school that violates**  
 40 **subsection (a) or (b) commits a Class C infraction.**

41 SECTION 7. IC 9-19-13-5.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
 42 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY



1, 2014]: **Sec. 5.5. (a) Each occupant of a school bus or special purpose bus that has a 3-point lap and shoulder safety belt installed at each seating location in accordance with section 3.5 of this chapter shall have the lap and shoulder safety belt properly fastened about the occupant's body at all times when the bus is in motion.**

**(b) A school corporation, nonpublic school, or owner of a school bus or special purpose bus, including a school bus or special purpose bus operated under a fleet or transportation contract, that authorizes or permits a violation of subsection (a) commits a Class C infraction.**

SECTION 8. IC 20-20-41 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]:

**Chapter 41. Safety Belt Revolving Loan Fund**

**Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the safety belt revolving loan fund established by section 2 of this chapter.**

**Sec. 2. (a) The safety belt revolving loan fund is established for the purposes of this chapter. The department shall administer the fund.**

**(b) The department shall pay the expenses of administering the fund.**

**(c) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same manner as other public funds may be invested. Interest that accrues from these investments shall be deposited in the fund.**

**(d) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund.**

**(e) Money in the fund is continuously appropriated for the purposes of this chapter.**

**Sec. 3. (a) The department shall establish a revolving loan program to provide loans from the fund to school corporations to assist school corporations in paying expenses necessary to comply with the requirements under IC 9-19-13-3.5 concerning safety belts on school buses and special purpose buses.**

**(b) The department shall establish the following:**

**(1) Standards of eligibility.**

**(2) The maximum amount of a loan that may be awarded to a school corporation.**

**(3) Application procedures.**

**(4) Any local matching funds that are required.**

**(5) Any other provisions necessary to administer the loan**

- 2           **(c) The department may not charge interest on a loan from the**
- 3           **fund.**
- 4           **(d) The department shall deposit repayments of principal on**
- 5           **loans in the fund to increase the amount that is available for new**
- 6           **loans.**
- 7           **Sec. 4. A school corporation may use any source of revenue to**
- 8           **repay a loan under this chapter, including money in the school**
- 9           **corporation's school bus replacement fund, transportation fund, or**
- 10           **capital projects fund.**
- 11           **Sec. 5. If a school corporation fails to make any repayments of**
- 12           **a loan from the fund, the auditor of state shall withhold the**
- 13           **repayment amount from any other money payable by the state to**
- 14           **the school corporation. The amount withheld shall be transferred**
- 15           **to the fund to the credit of the school corporation.**
- 16           **Sec. 6. (a) There is appropriated to the fund ten million dollars**
- 17           **(\$10,000,000) from the state general fund for the period beginning**
- 18           **July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2016, to carry out the purposes**
- 19           **of the fund.**
- 20           **(b) This section expires July 1, 2016.**
- 21           SECTION 9. IC 20-27-3-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.107-2006,
- 22           SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
- 23           JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 4. (a) The committee has the following powers:
- 24           (1) The committee may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 establishing
- 25           standards for the construction of school buses and special purpose
- 26           buses, including minimum standards for the construction of
- 27           school buses and special purpose buses necessary to be issued a:
- 28           (A) valid certificate of inspection decal; and
- 29           (B) temporary certificate of inspection decal described in
- 30           IC 20-27-7-10.
- 31           (2) The committee may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 establishing
- 32           standards for the equipment of school buses and special purpose
- 33           buses, including minimum standards for the equipment of school
- 34           buses and special purpose buses necessary to be issued a:
- 35           (A) valid certificate of inspection decal; and
- 36           (B) temporary certificate of inspection decal described in
- 37           IC 20-27-7-10.
- 38           (3) The committee may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 specifying
- 39           the minimum standards that must be met to avoid the issuance of
- 40           an out-of-service certificate of inspection decal.
- 41           (4) The committee may provide for the inspection of all school
- 42           buses and special purpose buses, new or old, that are offered for





1 sale, lease, or contract.

2 (5) The committee may provide for the annual inspection of all  
3 school buses and special purpose buses and the issuance of  
4 certificate of inspection decals.

5 (6) The committee may maintain an approved list of school buses  
6 and special purpose buses that have passed inspection tests under  
7 subdivision (4) or (5).

8 (7) The committee may, subject to approval by the state board of  
9 accounts, prescribe standard forms for school bus driver contracts.

10 (8) The committee may hear appeals brought under  
11 IC 20-27-7-15.

12 **(9) The committee shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 for the**  
13 **design, installation, and use of 3-point lap and shoulder safety**  
14 **belt systems that must be installed in all school buses and**  
15 **special purpose buses that are first placed into operation by**  
16 **a school corporation after June 30, 2015, or used after June**  
17 **30, 2019, in accordance with IC 9-19-13-3.5.**

18 (b) The committee shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to set  
19 performance standards and measurements for determining the physical  
20 ability necessary for an individual to be a school bus driver.

21 (c) The certificate of inspection decals shall be issued to correspond  
22 with each school year. Each certificate of inspection decal expires on  
23 September 30 following the school year in which the certificate of  
24 inspection decal is effective. However, for buses that are described in  
25 IC 20-27-7-7, the certificate of inspection decal expires on a date that  
26 is not later than seven (7) months after the date of the first inspection  
27 for the particular school year.

28 SECTION 10. IC 20-27-7-8, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2005,  
29 SECTION 11, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
30 JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 8. The inspection of a special purpose bus shall  
31 consist of an inspection to determine the existence and condition of the  
32 vehicle's:

33 (1) brakes;

34 (2) lights (headlamps, tail lamps, brake lights, clearance lights,  
35 and turn signals);

36 (3) steering and suspension;

37 (4) exhaust systems;

38 (5) general body condition; ~~and~~

39 (6) tires; ~~and~~

40 **(7) after June 30, 2015, 3-point lap and shoulder safety belt**  
41 **systems.**
