HOUSE BILL No. 1279

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-34-3-11, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2005, 2 SECTION 18, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 3 JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 11. (a) The governing body of a school 4 corporation may shall require students to be tested for lead poisoning. 5 (b) If a student's parent states in writing that the parent is financially 6 unable to pay for a test under this section, the student shall be referred 7 to the free clinic or public health facility in the area that provides 8 services for indigents. 9 (c) The state department of health and the state board shall adopt 10 joint rules concerning lead poisoning testing under this section. 11 (d) Records of all tests administered under this section shall be 12 made and continuously maintained by the state department of health to 13 provide information useful in protecting, promoting, and maintaining

14 the health of students.
