DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-8-15.

Synopsis: Social work and substance abuse prevention. Requires the office of the secretary of family and social services (office of the secretary) to implement an evidence based model of social work and substance abuse prevention that includes partnering with elementary and high schools to provide social and emotional support services to children, parents, caregivers, teachers, and the community. Requires the office of the secretary to contract with an entity to implement the evidence based model, and sets forth requirements that the contractor must meet. Makes an annual appropriation.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 12-8-15 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS

6	Sec. 1. The office of the secretary shall implement an evidence
7	based model of social work and substance abuse prevention that

9	IC 20-18-2-4) and high schools (as defined in IC 20-18-2-7) to
10	provide social and emotional support services to children, parents
11	caregivers, teachers, and the community to prevent substance
12	abuse, promote healthy behaviors, and maximize student success
13	Sec. 2. The model described in section 1 of this chapter mus
14	include the following:
15	(1) Early intervention and prevention of substance abuse and
16	mental health issues, including:
17	(A) problem identification and assessment;

16	Internal Revenue Code.
17	(2) Be incorporated or registered in Indiana as a business

22	history of data collection and evaluation that demonstrates
23	successful outcomes in the criteria listed in subdivision (5);

25	(B) experience as a grant recipient with the evidence based
26	program model developed under P.L.205-2013, SECTION
27	8, and maintained by the office of the secretary.
28	(3) Employ and supervise the employment of individuals who
29	have earned a master's degree in social work to provide
30	services under the evidence based model described in section
31	1 of this chapter.
32	(4) Conduct assessments to determine:
33	(A) the readiness of a potential partner school and
34	community to implement the evidence based model
35	described in section 1 of this chapter; and
36	(B) the feasibility of continued funding support for the
37	evidence based model described in section 1 of this chapter
38	from the potential partner school and community.
39	(5) Contract with an independent third party to prepare and
40	submit an annual report to the office of the secretary that:
41	(A) evaluates the entity's success at:

14	(7) Receive at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the total
15	funding cost for implementation of the evidence based model
16	from:
17	(A) partner schools;
18	(B) public sources other than funds appropriated under
19	this chapter; and
20	(C) private sources, including:
21	(i) private foundations;
22	(ii) corporate foundations;
23	(iii) corporations;
24	(iv) businesses; and
25	(v) individuals.
26	Sec. 4. A contracting entity under section 3 of this chapter may
27	use funds received under a contract with the office of the secretary
28	under this chapter to pay expenses related to providing services
29	under the evidence based model to:
30	(1) partner schools existing at the time the contract becomes

32	(2) new partner schools.
33	Sec. 5. The office of the secretary shall provide a copy of the
34	report required by section 3(5) of this chapter to the legislative

37	purpose of paying administrative expenses incurred by the office
38	of the secretary in carrying out the oversight of the requirements

12	SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017] (a) There is



1	appropriated to the office of the secretary:

4	(2) for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending
5	June 30, 2019, ten million dollars (\$10,000,000);
5	from the state general fund to implement IC 12-8-15, as added by
7	this act.
8	(b) This SECTION expires July 1, 2019.
