DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-38.1-1; IC 25-38.1-3.

Synopsis: Veterinary education equivalence. Provides that for purposes of obtaining and renewing a veterinarian license, the Program for the Assessment of Veterinary Education Equivalence is considered an approved educational program. Requires the board of veterinary medical examiners to amend rules to make conforming changes.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

HOUSE BILL No. 1289

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-38.1-1-10.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 10.7. "PAVE certificate" refers
4	to a Program for the Assessment of Veterinary Education
5	Equivalence certificate issued by the American Association of
6	Veterinary State Boards, indicating that the holder has
7	demonstrated knowledge and skill equivalent to that possessed by
8	a graduate of an accredited college of veterinary medicine.
9	SECTION 2. IC 25-38.1-1-14, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2008,
0	SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
1	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 14. "Veterinarian" means an individual who:
2	(1) was a licensed veterinarian on August 31, 1979; or who
3	(2) has received a professional degree from an accredited college
4	of veterinary medicine;
5	(3) holds an ECFVG certificate; or
6	(4) holds a PAVE certificate.



1	SECTION 3. IC 25-38.1-3-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.177-2009.
2	SECTION 59, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 1. (a) A person may not practice veterinary
4	medicine in Indiana unless the person:
5	(1) is licensed as a veterinarian in Indiana; or
6	(2) holds a special permit issued by the board.
7	(b) The following persons are exempt from the licensing or special
8	permit requirements of this chapter:
9	(1) A veterinarian on the faculty of the School of Veterinary
10	Medicine at Purdue University performing regular duties, or a
11	veterinarian employed by the animal disease diagnostic laboratory
12	established by IC 21-46-3-1 performing regular duties.
13	(2) A veterinary medical officer serving in the United States
14	armed forces or veterinarian employed by a federal, state, or local
15	government agency performing veterinary medical services that
16	are within the scope of official duties and are performed during
17	the period of the person's service.
18	(3) An individual who is a regular student in an accredited college
19	of veterinary medicine performing duties or actions assigned by
20	the faculty of the School of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue
21	University or working under the direct supervision of a licensed
22	veterinarian.
23	(4) An extern.
24	(5) A veterinarian who is licensed and is a resident in another
25	state or country and consults with a veterinarian licensed under
26	this article.
27	(6) An owner or a contract operator of an animal or a regular
28	employee of the owner or a contract operator caring for and
29	treating an animal, except where the ownership of the animal was
30	transferred for purposes of circumventing this chapter.
31	(7) A guest lecturing or giving instructions or demonstrations as
32	the School of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue University, or
33	elsewhere, in connection with a continuing education program.
34	(8) An individual while engaged in bona fide scientific research
35	that:
36	(A) reasonably requires experimentation involving animals
37	and
38	(B) is conducted in a facility or with a company that complies
39	with federal regulations regarding animal welfare.
40	(9) A graduate of a foreign college of veterinary medicine who is
41	in the process of obtaining an ECFVG certificate or PAVE
42	certificate and who is under the direct supervision of:



1	(A) the faculty of the School of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue
2	University; or
3	(B) a veterinarian licensed under this article.
4	(10) A veterinarian who is enrolled in a postgraduate instructional
5	program in an accredited college of veterinary medicine
6	performing duties or actions assigned by the faculty of the School
7	of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue University.
8	(11) A member in good standing of another licensed or regulated
9	profession within Indiana who:
10	(A) provides assistance requested by a veterinarian licensed
11	under this article;
12	(B) acts with the consent of the client;
13	(C) acts within a veterinarian-client-patient relationship; and
14	(D) acts under the direct or indirect supervision of the licensed
15	veterinarian.
16	SECTION 4. IC 25-38.1-3-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.58-2008,
17	SECTION 28, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
18	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 2. To become a licensed veterinarian, a person
19	must:
20	(1) not have a conviction for a crime that has a direct bearing on
21	the person's ability to practice ethically and competently;
22	(2) not have committed an act that would have been a violation of
23	IC 25-1-9-4 or IC 25-1-9-6;
24	(3) pay the fees required under this article;
25	(4) have successfully:
26	(A) completed a program in veterinary medicine from an
27	accredited college of veterinary medicine; and or
28	(B) received an ECFVG certificate or a PAVE certificate;
29	and
30	(5) have successfully completed the examinations described in
31	section 4 of this chapter or qualify for a license without
32	examination under section 5 of this chapter.
33	However, a person who was licensed as a veterinarian in Indiana on
34	August 31, 1979, is not required to meet the requirements of
35	subdivision (4) or (5).
36	SECTION 5. IC 25-38.1-3-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2008,
37	SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
38	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 3. (a) As used in this subsection, "term" refers to
39	an academic semester, trimester, or quarter. A person desiring a license
40	to practice veterinary medicine shall make written application to the
41	board. The application must state that the applicant: is:
42	(1) is a graduate of an accredited college of veterinary medicine;

2	(2) is enrolled in the last term of the last year of the veterinary
3	medical curriculum of an accredited school of veterinary
4	medicine;
5	(3) holds an ECFVG certificate; or
6	(4) holds a PAVE certificate.
7	If the applicant is enrolled as a last term student as described in
8	subdivision (2), a letter from the dean of the student's veterinary school
9	confirming that the applicant is a last term student, attesting to the
10	satisfactory academic standing of the student, and stating the date on
11	which the degree is expected to be conferred upon the student must
12	accompany the application. A license to practice veterinary medicine
13	in Indiana may not be issued until satisfactory proof has been furnished
14	to the board either that the applicant has graduated from an accredited
15	college of veterinary medicine or that the applicant is the holder of an
16	Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates (ECFVG)
17	certificate or a Program for the Assessment of Veterinary
18	Education Equivalence (PAVE) certificate. The application must
19	show reasonable information and proof required by the board by rule.
20	The application must be accompanied by the required fee.
21	(b) If the board determines that the applicant possesses the proper
22	qualifications, the board may grant the applicant a license. If the board
23	determines that the applicant is not qualified to take the examination
24	or that the applicant does not qualify for a license without examination,
25	the executive secretary of the board shall immediately notify the
26	applicant in writing of the finding and the grounds for the finding.
27	Applicants found unqualified may request a hearing on the question of
28	their qualifications.
29	SECTION 6. IC 25-38.1-3-5, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2008,
30	SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
31	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 5. The board may issue a license without an
32	examination to a qualified applicant who:
33	(1) furnishes satisfactory proof that the applicant:
34	(A) is a graduate of an accredited college of veterinary
35	medicine; or
36	(B) holds an Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary

3	(3) otherwise meets the requirements of this chapter.
4	SECTION 7. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014] (a) Before September
5	1, 2014, the Indiana board of veterinary medical examiners shall
6	amend 888 IAC 1.1-6-1 and 888 IAC 1.1-7-1 to include holders of
7	a Program for the Assessment of Veterinary Education
8	Equivalence (PAVE) certificate as qualified applicants as provided
9	by this act.
10	(b) This SECTION expires June 30, 2015.
