# HOUSE BILL No. 1300

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 21-13-5.5.

**Synopsis:** Reservist scholarship program. Establishes the armed forces reservist tuition scholarship program fund to provide scholarships to certain individuals actively serving in a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States. Provides that the commission for higher education may use money appropriated to the commission for any other purpose to award scholarships under the armed forces reservist tuition scholarship program.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

### HOUSE BILL No. 1300

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

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1 (2) currently actively serving in a reserve component of the 2 armed forces of the United States; and 3 (3) enrolled in a qualified degree program. 4 Sec. 3. (a) The armed forces reservist tuition scholarship 5 program fund is established to provide the financial resources 6 necessary to award the tuition scholarships authorized under the 7 program. 8 (b) The commission shall administer the fund. 9 (c) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from 10 money in the fund. 11 (d) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not 12 revert to the state general fund but remains available to be used for 13 providing money for armed forces reservist tuition scholarships 14 under this chapter. 15 Sec. 4. Subject to section 5 of this chapter, money in the armed 16 forces reservist tuition scholarship program fund shall be used to 17 provide annual tuition scholarships to scholarship applicants in an 18 amount that is equal to one (1) of the following amounts: 19 (1) If the scholarship applicant does not receive other 20 financial assistance specifically designated for educational 21 costs, the amount equal to a full tuition scholarship to attend 22 the state educational institution. 23 (2) If the scholarship applicant receives other financial 24 assistance specifically designated for educational costs, the 25 amount: 26 (A) equal to the balance required to attend the state 27 educational institution; and 28 (B) not to exceed the amount described in subdivision (1). 29 Sec. 5. (a) Subject to subsection (b), each tuition scholarship 30 awarded under this chapter: (1) may be renewed under this chapter for a total tuition 31 32 scholarship award that does not exceed the equivalent of the 33 number of terms that constitutes four (4) undergraduate 34 academic years; and 35 (2) is subject to other eligibility criteria as established by the 36 commission. 37 (b) A tuition scholarship awarded under this chapter may not 38 be renewed if the scholarship applicant fails to maintain at least a 39 cumulative grade point average that the state educational 40 institution determines is satisfactory academic progress. 41 (c) The total of all tuition scholarships awarded under this 42 chapter in a state fiscal year may not exceed the amount available



1 for distribution from the fund for tuition scholarships under this 2 chapter. If the total amount to be distributed from the fund in a 3 state fiscal year exceeds the amount available for distribution, the 4 amount to be distributed to each eligible scholarship applicant 5 shall be proportionately reduced so that the total reductions equal 6 the amount of the excess based on the relative financial need of 7 each eligible scholarship applicant. 8 Sec. 6. Notwithstanding any other law, the commission may use
