ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1302

DIGEST OF HB 1302 (Updated February 20, 2024 10:01 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Emergency medical services. Provides that not later than July 15, 2024, the county executive shall provide the department of homeland security (department) certain information relating to each emergency medical services (EMS) provider in the county. Provides that not later than August 15, 2024, the department, in consultation with the Indiana emergency medical services commission, shall prepare and submit a report to the general assembly relating to the provision of EMS. Urges the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of improving the provision of EMS throughout Indiana.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1302

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024] (a) As used in this
2 SECTION, "executive" has the meaning set forth in IC 36-1-2-5.
3 (b) As used in this SECTION, "department" refers to the
4 department of homeland security established by IC 10-19-2-1.
5 (c) As used in this SECTION, "EMS" means emergency medical
6 services regulated by the department under IC 16-31-3.
7 (d) Not later than July 15, 2024, the county executive of each
8 county shall submit to the department, on a form and in a manner
9 prescribed by the department, the following information:
10 (1) Each EMS provider that provides services in the county.
11 (2) Each EMS provider in the county that provides services to
12 an adjacent county.
13 (3) The funding source for each EMS provider described in
14 subdivision (1).
15 (4) The level of care provided by each EMS provider in the
16 county, including a description of the:
17 (A) basic life support (BLS) services; and
18 (B) advanced life support (ALS) services;

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- 1 provided by the EMS provider.
- 2 (5) The average response time for each EMS provider in the
- 3 county disaggregated by:
- 4 (A) nontransport EMS units; and
- 5 (B) transport EMS units.
- 6 (6) Factors that result in a longer average response time in
- 7 certain jurisdictions within the county disaggregated by:
- 8 (A) nontransport EMS units; and
- 9 (B) transport EMS units.
- 10 (7) Any information the department, in consultation with the
- 11 Indiana emergency medical services commission established
- 12 by IC 16-31-2-1, determines is necessary or useful to include.
- 13 (e) Not later than August 15, 2024, the department, in
- 14 consultation with the Indiana emergency medical services
- 15 commission established by IC 16-31-2-1, shall prepare and submit
- 16 a report to the general assembly in an electronic format under
- 17 IC 5-14-6 that includes the following:
- 18 (1) A summary of the information provided to the department
- 19 under subsection (d).
- 20 (2) Any information the department determines is necessary
- 21 or useful to include.
- 22 (3) Any recommendations by the department to improve EMS
- 23 throughout Indiana.
- 24 (f) The department shall require EMS providers to provide
- 25 information necessary, in a manner prescribed by the department,
- 26 to prepare the report described in subsection (e).
- 27 (g) This SECTION expires July 1, 2025.
- 28 SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024] (a) The legislative
- 29 council is urged to assign to the appropriate interim study
- 30 committee established under IC 2-5 for the 2024 interim the topic
- 31 of improving the provision of emergency medical services (EMS)
- 32 throughout Indiana.
- 33 (b) This SECTION expires January 1, 2025.
