### HOUSE BILL No. 1307

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 22-13-4-1.6; IC 24-4-15.5.

**Synopsis:** Assistance for the hearing impaired. Requires the fire prevention and building safety commission (commission) to adopt rules requiring the installation of assistive listening systems that provide a wireless direct connection to the listener, such as audio frequency induction loop systems (AFILs), and beacon positioning systems in Class 1 structures located in a first or second class city. (Under current law, the commission is required to adopt rules requiring that a person must consider the installation of AFILs and beaconing position systems.) Provides that if an owner, operator, or employee of a retail establishment wears a face mask while interacting with customers during a public health emergency, an owner, operator or employee must, upon request, wear a face mask that is transparent to allow for lip reading. Provides that a customer may file a complaint with the local health department. Provides that a local health department may issue a letter of reprimand to the retail establishment if it receives more than five complaints.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning labor and safety.

#### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

12	major alteration of an existing facility's public address system

17	system, unless installation of an audio frequency induction
18	loop system or similar system would be impractical; and
19	(B) at least one (1) bid for the installation of a beacon
20	positioning system unless installation of a beacon positioning
21	system would be impractical;
22	(4) adopt American National Standards Institute (ANSI) and
23	International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) standards for
24	audio frequency induction loop system installation, maintenance,
25	and performance; and
26	(5) develop standards for installation and maintenance of a
27	beacon positioning system.
28	(c) For the purposes of this section, the installation of an
29	assistive listening system that provides a wireless direct connection
30	to the listener, such as an audio frequency induction loop system,
31	and a beacon positioning system is considered to be impractical if
32	the cost of the installation exceeds two percent (2%) of the total

35	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
36	JULY 1, 2021]:
37	Chapter 15.5. Transparent Face Masks
38	Sec. 1. This chapter applies to a retail establishment that is open
39	for business during a public health emergency declared under
40	IC 10-14.
41	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "customer" means a person who
42	is lawfully on the premises of a retail establishment.



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Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "face mask" means a covering for the nose and mouth that is worn to reduce the spread of an infectious agent or other pathogen.

Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "retail establishment" means a place of business that is open to the general public for the sale of goods or services.

Sec. 5. (a) If an owner, operator, or employee of a retail
establishment wears a face mask while interacting with a customer,
the customer may request that the owner, operator, or employee
wear a face mask that is wholly or partially transparent to allow
for lip reading.

(b) Upon a request made under subsection (a), the owner,
operator, or employee of a retail establishment must wear a face
mask that is wholly or partially transparent to allow for lip reading
while interacting with the customer who made the request.

Sec. 6. (a) A customer aggrieved by a violation of section 5 of
this chapter may file a complaint with a local health department
(as defined in IC 16-18-2-211(a)).

(b) If a local health department receives more than five (5)
complaints against a retail establishment, the local health
department may issue a letter of reprimand to the retail
establishment.



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
