DIGEST OF HB 1309 (Updated January 24, 2017 10:59 am - DI 84)

Citations Affected: IC 22-12.

Synopsis: Indiana fire academy funding. Provides that money in the fire and building services fund may be used to defray the expenses and capital outlay associated with the creation, development, and maintenance of: (1) a central campus for the fire and public safety training academy; and (2) educational programs and training opportunities offered to public safety officers by the academy, including increasing these programs and opportunities.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

HOUSE BILL No. 1309

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning labor and safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 22-12-6-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.101-2006,
SECTION 33, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 1. (a) The fire and building services fund is
established for the purpose of:
(1) defraying the personal personnel services, other operating
expense, and capital outlay of: the following:
(1) (A) the department;
(2) (B) the education board and the rules board; and
(3) (C) the commission; and
(2) defraying the expenses and capital outlay associated with
the creation, development, and maintenance of:
(A) a central campus for the Indiana fire and public safety
academy training system; and
(B) educational programs and training opportunities
offered to public safety personnel by the Indiana fire and
public safety academy training system, including
increasing these programs and opportunities.

1 2 3	(b) The fund shall be administered by the department. Money collected for deposit in the fund shall be deposited at least monthly with the treasurer of state.
4	(c) The treasurer of state shall deposit the following collected
5	amounts in the fund:
6	(1) Fire insurance policy premium taxes assessed under section 5
7	of this chapter.
8	(2) Except as provided in section 6(d) of this chapter, all fees
9	collected under this chapter.
10	(3) Any money not otherwise described in this subsection but
11	collected by the division of fire and building safety.
12	(4) Any money not otherwise described in this subsection but
13	collected by the department, commission, education board, or
14	rules board and designated for distribution to the fund by statute
15	or the executive director of the department.
16	(5) A fee collected by the education board for the issuance of a
17	certification under IC 22-14-2-7.
18	(d) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
19	currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
20	manner as other public funds may be invested.
21	(e) Money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year does not revert to
22	the state general fund.
