## **HOUSE BILL No. 1312**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 5-22-14.

**Synopsis:** Veteran business enterprises. Defines "veteran", for the purpose of qualifying as a veteran owned small business by the Indiana department of administration, as an individual who: (1) served on active duty in any branch of the armed forces of the United States or their reserves, or served in the Indiana National Guard; and (2) received an honorable discharge from service. Requires that a business seeking to qualify as a small business owned and operated by veterans have current certification as a veteran owned small business by the Indiana department of administration. Provides that certain information submitted by an applicant for certification as a veteran owned small business is confidential.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning veterans.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

8	1, 2016]: Sec. 2.5. As used in this chapter, "veteran" means an
9	individual who:

1	(A) on active duty in any branch of the armed forces of the
2	United States or their reserves; or
3	(B) in the Indiana National Guard; and
4	(2) received an honorable discharge from service.
5	SECTION 3. IC 5-22-14-3.5, AS ADDED BY P.L.90-2013,

7	JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 3.5. (a) A business qualifies as a small business



1	for purposes of this chapter if the business is an Indiana small business
2	concern owned and controlled by veterans, as defined in
3	15 U.S.C. 632(q)(3) as in effect January 1, 2013, or is an Indiana
4	small business owned and operated by veterans (as defined in
5	section 2.5 of this chapter) and the business:
6	(1) has:
7	(A) a current verification as a veteran owned small business
8	concern under 38 CFR 74, et seq., by the Center of Veterans
9	Enterprise of the United States Department of Veterans
10	Affairs; or
11	(B) current certification as a veteran owned small business
12	by the Indiana department of administration;
13	(2) is owned and controlled by one (1) or more veterans who have
14	been residents of Indiana for at least one (1) year before making
15	an offer or, in the case of a corporation, have at least fifty-one
16	percent (51%) of the corporation's stock owned by one (1) or
17	more veterans who have been residents of Indiana for at least one
18	(1) year before making an offer; and
19	(3) has its principal place of business located in Indiana.
20	(b) The Indiana economic development corporation may assist the
21	Indiana department of administration in doing any of the following:
22	(1) Compiling and maintaining a comprehensive list of veterar
23	owned small businesses.
24	(2) Assisting veteran owned small businesses in complying with
25	the procedures for bidding on state contracts.
26	(3) Examining requests from the Indiana department of
27	administration for the purchase of supplies or services to help
28	determine which purchases may be consistent with the goal
29	described in section 11(a) of this chapter.
30	(4) Simplifying specifications and contract terms to increase the
31	opportunities for veteran owned small businesses to participate in
32	state contracts.
33	(c) The Indiana economic development corporation, in consultation
34	with the Indiana department of administration, may develop programs
35	to encourage cities, counties, towns, townships, and private businesses
36	to adopt the goal for contracts with veteran owned small businesses
37	described in section 11(a) of this chapter.
38	(d) For purposes of this chapter, information submitted by ar

9	SECTION 68, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
10	JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 11. (a) The Indiana department of administration
11	shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to do the following:
12	(1) Increase contracting opportunities for Indiana veteran owned
	small businesses described in section 3.5 of this chapter with a
13 14	goal to procure in each state fiscal year at least three percent (3%) of state contracts with Indiana veteran owned small businesses.

16	(2) Develop procurement policies and procedures to accomplish
17	the goal described in subdivision (1), including guidelines to be
	followed by the Indiana department of administration in
18	conducting the department's procurement efforts.
19	(3) Implement IC 5-22-14-3.5.
20	These procurement policies do not apply to a procurement of supplies
21	and services to address immediate and serious government needs at a
22	time of emergency, including a threat to the public health, welfare, or
23	safety that may arise by reason of floods, epidemics, riots, acts of
24	terrorism, major power failures, a threat proclaimed by the President of
25	the United States or the governor, or a threat declared by the
26	commissioner of the Indiana department of administration.
27	(b) The Indiana department of administration shall annually
28	evaluate its progress in meeting the goal described in this section for
29	the previous state fiscal year. Beginning in 2014, after June 30 and
30	before November 1 of each year, the Indiana department of
31	administration shall submit a report to the governor, the Indiana
32	department of veterans' affairs, and the interim study committee on
33	public safety and military affairs established by IC 2-5-1.3-4 and the
34	legislative council in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6. The report
35	must include:
36	(1) the percentage goal obtained by the Indiana department of
37	administration during the previous state fiscal year; and
38	(2) a summary of why the Indiana department of administration
39	failed to meet the goal and what actions are being taken by the
40	Indiana department of administration to meet the goal in the
41	current state fiscal year.
42	(c) The Indiana department of administration shall post the report



1	described in subsection (b) on the department's Internet web site not
2	later than thirty (30) days after the report is submitted. The Indiana
3	department of veterans' affairs shall post the report described in
4	subsection (b) on the department's Internet web site not later than thirty
5	(30) days after the report is submitted by the Indiana department of
6	administration.
