## **HOUSE BILL No. 1331**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 25-1-9.5-8; IC 25-24-1-1.5.

**Synopsis:** Telemedicine and medical devices. Removes the restriction on the prescribing of ophthalmic devices through telemedicine and sets conditions on when a provider may, through telemedicine, prescribe medical devices. Prohibits the Indiana optometry board from setting standards for the practice of ocular telemedicine or ocular telehealth that are more restrictive than the standards established for in person practice.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1331**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-1-9.5-8, AS ADDED BY P.L.78-2016
2	SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 8. A provider may issue a prescription to a patien
4	who is receiving services through the use of telemedicine even if the
5	patient has not been seen previously by the provider in person if the
6	following conditions are met:
7	(1) The provider has satisfied the applicable standard of care in
8	the treatment of the patient.
9	(2) The issuance of the prescription by the provider is within the
10	provider's scope of practice and certification.
11	(3) The prescription is not for a controlled substance (as defined
12	in IC 35-48-1-9).
13	(4) The prescription is not for an abortion inducing drug (as
14	defined in IC 16-18-2-1.6).
15	(5) The prescription is not for an ophthalmic device, including:
16	(A) glasses;
17	(B) contact lenses; or



1	(C) low vision devices.
2	(5) If the prescription is for a medical device, including an
3	ophthalmic device, the provider must use telemedicine
4	technology that is sufficient to allow the provider to make an
5	informed diagnosis and treatment plan that includes the
6	medical device being prescribed.
7	SECTION 2. IC 25-24-1-1.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
8	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
9	1, 2017]: Sec. 1.5. The board may not establish standards
10	concerning the practice of ocular telemedicine or ocular telehealth
11	that are more restrictive than the standards that are set under this
12	article or by administrative rule and are applicable to the
13	practitioner's in person ocular practice.
