DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-28.

Synopsis: Mentor teachers; national board certification. Provides for the development of a mentoring program for beginning teachers, teachers who receive a designation of "improvement necessary" or "ineffective", teachers who request the assignment of a mentor, and teachers who are seeking national board certification. Requires the department of education to provide training through educational service centers for teachers who meet certain requirements and wish to become mentors. Provides that a teacher who serves as a mentor receives an annual salary supplement of \$500 for each teacher who is receiving mentoring services. Establishes the goal that by 2035, there will be at least one teacher who is certified by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (national board) in every public school. Establishes the teachers' national board certification incentive fund for purposes of: (1) reimbursing 50% of the national board certification fee; and (2) funding stipends for national board certified teachers who serve as mentors to other teachers. Provides for an annual salary supplement of \$1,000 for a national board certified teacher.

HOUSE BILL No. 1332

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-28-13 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

4	Chapter 13. Mentor Teachers
5	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "beginning teacher" means an
6	individual who holds an initial practitioner's license.
7	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "mentor" means a highly skilled,
8	experienced teacher who:
9	(1) either:
10	(A) is certified as a mentor under this chapter; or
l 1	(B) holds national board certification (as defined in
12	IC 20-28-14-5); and
13	(2) provides systematic and ongoing support and assistance to
14	other teachers in a school or school corporation to help the
15	other teachers improve their teaching skills and practices.



1	Sec. 3. (a) The department shall establish a training program to
2	certify mentors.
3	(b) Training for mentors shall be provided at no cost to mentors
4	or school corporations through educational service centers
5	established under IC 20-20-1. Training must be conducted on days
6	on which school is not in session.
7	(c) The training program must provide methods, skills, and
8	supplies to allow the mentor to demonstrate:
9	(1) effective teaching practices;
10	(2) the ability to work cooperatively to aid the professional
11	growth of another teacher;
12	(3) the ability to relate effectively to adult learners; and
13	(4) the ability to be reflective and articulate about the craft of
14	teaching.
15	Sec. 4. (a) A teacher who:
16	(1) holds a proficient practitioner's license and has at least
17	five (5) years experience in teaching; and
18	(2) receives a designation of "effective" or "highly effective"
19	in an evaluation under IC 20-28-11.5;
20	is eligible to receive training as a mentor.
21	(b) This subsection applies to a teacher who holds a proficient
22	practitioner's license and has not been previously certified as a
23	mentor. To be certified as a mentor, the teacher must successfully
24	complete two (2) days of training.
25	(c) This subsection applies to a teacher who has been certified
26	as a mentor under a previous mentor program. To be certified as
27	a mentor, the teacher must successfully complete one (1) day of
28	training.
29	(d) A teacher who successfully completes mentor training under
30	this section is entitled to receive professional growth experience
31	points for the training.
32	(e) A mentor shall receive an annual salary supplement of five
33	hundred dollars (\$500) for each teacher to whom the mentor is
34	assigned.
35	Sec. 5. (a) A school corporation may apply to the department to
36	send teachers to mentor training after the school corporation has
37	determined how many mentors are needed in the school
38	corporation.
39	(b) The department shall accept teachers for the mentor
40	training program based upon available funding.
41	Sec. 6. (a) Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, as a part
42	of a school corporation's beginning teacher residency program,



1	each principal shall match a beginning teacher with a mentor who

3	(1) in the same school building;
4	(2) at or near the same grade level; and

33	Sec. 1. The general assembly establishes a goal that by 2035
34	there will be at least one (1) national board certified teacher in

36	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the teachers'
37	national board certification incentive fund established by section
38	6 of this chapter.
39	Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "mentor" has the meaning set
40	forth in IC 20-28-13-2.

Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "national board" refers to the

National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, a



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1	nonpartisan, independent, and nonprofit board composed of
2	teachers and others that:
3	(1) has developed a set of standards for teachers; and
4	(2) operates a national voluntary system to assess and certify

17	national board certified teachers who serve as mentors to
18	other teachers under IC 20-28-13.
19	(b) The fund consists of appropriations to the fund and gifts,
20	grants, devises, or bequests made to the state to achieve the

22	(c) The department shall administer the fund.
23	(d) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
24	money in the fund. The treasurer of state shall invest the money in
25	the fund not currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund
26	in the same manner as other public money may be invested.
27	Interest that accrues from these investments shall be deposited in
28	the fund.
29	(e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not
30	revert to the state general fund.
31	(f) Money in the fund is appropriated continuously for the
32	purposes specified in this section.
33	Sec. 7. A school corporation may, at its own expense, provide
34	paid released time for teachers pursuing national board
35	certification.
36	Sec. 8. If a teacher does not successfully complete all

Sec. 9. A teacher who attains national board certification after

June 30, 2015, shall be reimbursed from the fund for fifty percent

(50%) of the certification fee for the initial ten (10) year certificate.

- Sec. 10. (a) A national board certified teacher is entitled to receive a stipend from the fund in addition to the teacher's annual compensation for serving as a mentor to teachers within the teacher's school or school corporation in a mentoring program approved by the department.
- (b) A national board certified teacher is not required to complete training under IC 20-28-13 to serve as a mentor.
- Sec. 11. (a) After June 30, 2015, a school corporation shall provide a public school teacher who has attained national board certification as of July 1, 2015, or thereafter with an annual national board certification salary supplement of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the life of the certificate.
- (b) If a national board certified teacher ceases to be employed as a classroom teacher or a teacher mentor in the field of the teacher's national certification, the salary supplement under this section ends.
- Sec. 12. The state board shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to carry out this chapter.
