DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 13-18-28.

Synopsis: Independent testing of Lake Michigan water. Requires the commissioner of the department of environmental management to engage an independent testing service to test and analyze the Indiana waters of Lake Michigan and report to the commissioner the results of its testing and analysis at least four times per year. Provides that the independent testing service must test and analyze the Indiana waters of Lake Michigan for the presence and concentration of pollutants that are known to constitute the greatest environmental problems for the Indiana waters of Lake Michigan. Requires that the results of the testing and analysis be made available to the public.

HOUSE BILL No. 1357

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning environmental law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 13-18-28 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE

4	Chapter 28. Independent Testing of Lake Michigan Water
5	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "independent testing service"
6	means a provider of water testing and assessment services:
7	(1) that:
8	(A) is not a part of; and
9	(B) is independent from;

11	(2) that may be:
12	(A) a not-for-profit entity; or
13	(B) a for-profit entity; and
14	(3) that has experience in testing for the presence of pollutants
15	in bodies of water.
16	Sec. 2. The commissioner shall engage an independent testing
17	service to test and analyze the Indiana waters of Lake Michigan



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1 and report to the commissioner the results of its testing and 2 analysis: 3 (1) at least four (4) times per year; or 4 (2) more frequently than provided in subdivision (1) if the 5 commissioner considers more frequent testing necessary. 6 Sec. 3. The independent testing service engaged under this 7 chapter must test and analyze the Indiana waters of Lake Michigan 8 for the presence and concentration of the pollutants that are known 9 to constitute the greatest environmental problems for the Indiana 10 waters of Lake Michigan, including: 11 (1) heavy metals such as lead, chromium, mercury, and 12 cadmium; 13 (2) chemicals such as polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), 14 polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), perfluoroalkyl 15 and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), and polybrominated 16 diphenyl ethers (PBDE); and 17 (3) pollutants from human activity, such as fecal coliform 18 bacteria, microplastics, and pharmaceuticals. 19 Sec. 4. The results of the testing and analysis of the independent 20 testing service under this chapter shall be made available to the 21 public. 22 SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020] (a) The general 23 assembly finds: 24 (1) that the unique character of Lake Michigan: 25 (A) as one (1) of the five (5) Great Lakes, which contain 26 more than twenty percent (20%) of the world's surface 27 fresh water; 28 (B) as a natural asset of enormous value to the state of 29 Indiana, in that it: 30 (i) offers very popular places of tourism, including both 31 a state park and a national park; 32 (ii) is a source of drinking water, industrial process 33 water, cooling water, and water for agricultural 34 irrigation; 35 (iii) provides the means of transporting enormous 36 quantities of commercial material in freighter ships; and 37 (iv) provides excellent recreational opportunities, 38 including fishing, boating, hiking, camping, sightseeing, 39 and field observation of rare plants, animals, and insects; 40 and 41 (C) as a water body that has experienced the 42 environmental effects of heavy industrial activity and large

2	creates a special need to monitor and protect the water of
3	Lake Michigan; and
4	(2) that, for purposes of Article 4, Section 23, of the
5	Constitution of the State of Indiana, the case of IC 13-18-28,
6	as added by this act, is one in which a general law cannot be
7	made applicable.
8	(b) This SECTION expires July 1, 2021.



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
