HOUSE ENROLLED ACT No. 1358

AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018] (a) The legislative council is urged to assign to the appropriate interim study committee the task of studying the topics described in this SECTION.

- (b) The legislative council is urged to assign the task of studying safety at intersections that are not controlled by a traffic signal when one (1) or more of the following conditions exist at an intersection:
 - (1) A parcel of land at the intersection is used as agricultural land and the following conditions exist:
 - (A) The land is located within a clear sight triangle of the intersection of two (2) or more roads, as determined using the clear sight triangle calculation method and Intersection Sight Distance (ISD) table included in the Federal Highway Administration's report "Intersection Safety: A Manual for Local Rural Road Owners" (report date January 1, 2011).
 - (B) The land may contain:
 - (i) crops that typically exceed a height of three (3) feet; or
 - (ii) any other vegetation, structures, signs, fences, walls, or obstructions owned or controlled by the property



- owner or a lessee of the property owner that exceed a height of three (3) feet.
- (2) Parking is permitted by a vehicle at a place where the vehicle obstructs the view of signage at the intersection by an individual operating a vehicle approaching the intersection.
- (c) The legislative council is urged to assign the task of studying safety issues caused by planting crops too close to rural roads and inadequate drainage of land along these roads causing high water to cover the road.
 - (d) This SECTION expires January 1, 2019.
