PRINTING CODE. Amendments: Whenever an existing statute (or a section of the Indiana Constitution) is being amended, the text of the existing provision will appear in this style type, additions will appear in **this style type**, and deletions will appear in ~~this style type~~.

Additions: Whenever a new statutory provision is being enacted (or a new constitutional provision adopted), the text of the new provision will appear in **this style type**. Also, the word **NEW** will appear in that style type in the introductory clause of each SECTION that adds a new provision to the Indiana Code or the Indiana Constitution.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to repeal a provision of the Indiana Code concerning health.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 16-19-14-7 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE UPON
- 2 PASSAGE]. ~~Sec. 7. This chapter expires July 1, 2014.~~
- 3 SECTION 2. **An emergency is declared for this act.**
