## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 10-13-9.

**Synopsis:** Data base of valuable metal transactions. Creates the valuable metal dealers registry. Allows the state police department to contract with a third party to maintain a valuable metal dealers data base.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1376**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1.1C 10-13-9 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2017]:
4	Chapter 9. Valuable Metal Dealers Data Base
5	Sec. 1. After December 31, 2017, a person may not engage in the
6	business of purchasing and reselling valuable metal (as defined in
7	IC 25-37.5-1-1) without registering as a valuable metal dealer (as
8	defined in IC 25-37.5-1-1) with the superintendent in accordance
9	with this chapter.
10	Sec. 2. The superintendent may issue, reissue, or deny
11	registration certificates to valuable metal dealers.
12	Sec. 3. To register as a valuable metal dealer with the
13	superintendent, a person must do the following:
14	(1) Provide the following information in an electronic format
15	prescribed by the department:
16	(A) The name and street address of the valuable metal
17	dealer's place of business.



1	(B) The name of the primary owner of the business, and of
2	the manager of the business, if the manager is not the
3	primary owner.
4	(C) The electronic mail address of the business.
5	(D) Confirmation that the valuable metal dealer is able to
6	connect electronically with the department for the purpose
7	of sending and receiving information.
8	(E) Any other information required by the superintendent.
9	(2) Pay an initial registration fee of two hundred dollars
10	(\$200).
11	Sec. 4. A registration certificate issued to a valuable metal
12	dealer is valid for a period of one (1) year. A valuable metal dealer
13	may renew the registration certificate in the manner prescribed by
14	the superintendent. The superintendent shall charge a renewal fee
15	of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) to cover the costs of maintaining
16	the registry described under this chapter.
17	Sec. 5. A valuable metal dealer registered under this chapter
18	shall prominently display at the valuable metal dealer's place of
19	business a copy of the annual registration certificate received from
20	the superintendent.
21	Sec. 6. Before January 1, 2018, the superintendent shall enter
22	into an agreement with a third party administrator to maintain a
23	registry of valuable metal dealers. The registry must be maintained
24	as a secure data base accessible for use by law enforcement
25	agencies that is capable of all the following:
26	(1) Receiving and securely storing all the information
27	required by section 3 of this chapter and the transaction data
28	that valuable metal dealers are required to collect under
29	IC 25-37.5-1-2.
30	(2) Providing secure search capabilities to law enforcement
31	agencies for enforcement purposes.
32	(3) Making the electronic data collected under this chapter
33	and IC 25-37.5-1-2 available through an electronic searchable
34	format for individual law enforcement agencies and for
35	valuable metal dealers in Indiana.
36	(4) Providing, without charge, interlink programming to
37	enable the transfer of information to valuable metal dealers.
38	Sec. 7. A valuable metal dealer may search, modify, or update
39	only the valuable metal dealer's own business data contained
40	within the registry maintained under this chapter.
41	Sec. 8. The superintendent may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2

necessary to implement this chapter.



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
