## **HOUSE BILL No. 1384**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 10-11-2-13.

**Synopsis:** State police salaries. Requires the office of management and budget to annually prepare and submit a report to the budget committee and the legislative council that compares the base salaries of: (1) police employees of the state police department; and (2) police officers of the three largest local police departments in Indiana. Requires the budget committee to review the report. Provides that the budget committee may make findings and recommendations regarding base salary parity between state police department police employees and the local police officers used for comparison. Requires the budget committee to report any of its findings and recommendations to the legislative council.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1384**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 10-11-2-13. AS AMENDED BY P.L.234-2007.

SECTION 306, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 13. (a) The board shall categorize
salaries of police employees within each rank based upon the rank held
and the number of years of service in the department through the
twentieth year. The salary ranges the board assigns to each rank shall
be divided into a base salary and twenty (20) increments above the base
salary, with:
(1) the base salary in the rank paid to a person with less than one
(1) year of service in the department; and
(2) the highest salary in the rank paid to a person with at least
twenty (20) years of service in the department.
(b) The salary matrix prescribed by this section shall be reviewed
and approved by the budget agency before implementation.
(c) The office of management and budget shall annually prepare
a report that compares the base salaries of police employees of the
department with the salaries of police officers who:



1	(1) have comparable years of couries and walls and
	(1) have comparable years of service and rank; and
2	(2) are employed by the three (3) largest police departments
3	of local units (as defined in IC 36-1-2-23).
4	The office of management and budget shall annually submit the
5	report to the budget committee and, in an electronic format under
6	IC 5-14-6, to the legislative council.
7	(d) The budget committee shall review the report. The budget
8	committee may make:
9	(1) findings as to whether police employees of the department
10	have base salary parity with the police officers of the police
11	departments of the local units that were used for comparison;

13	(2) recommendations as to any base salary adjustments or
14	other changes needed to achieve or maintain the parity under
15	subdivision (1).
16	The budget committee shall report any findings and
17	recommendations to the legislative council in an electronic format
18	under IC 5-14-6.
