ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1384

DIGEST OF HB 1384 (Updated February 22, 2018 3:02 pm - DI 132)

Citations Affected: IC 25-10.

Synopsis: Chiropractors. Amends the definition of "chiropractic". Removes certain acts that a chiropractor is prohibited from practicing. Provides that the board may adopt rules establishing health and sanitation standards for dry needling. Provides that accreditation of a chiropractic college for licensure purposes may be by a successor organization of the Accreditation Commission of the Council on Chiropractic Education. Requires that an applicant for a license to practice chiropractic must complete at least 90 semester hours of education after June 30, 2021. Prohibits an individual from using the title "chiropractor" unless the individual is a licensed chiropractor. Allows a chiropractor to perform certain acts and functions to diagnose and treat injuries, conditions, and disorders.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1384

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 25-10-1-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.1-2006
SECTION 427, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 1. As used in this article:
(1) "Chiropractic" means the examination, diagnosis, and
analysis evaluation, and treatment of human ailments and
conditions of any interference with normal nerve transmission
and expression, the procedure preparatory to and complementary
to the correction thereof by an adjustment or manipulation of the
articulations of the vertebral column, its immediate articulation
and includes including other incidental means of adjustments o
the spinal column, and the practice of drugless therapeutics
However, chiropractic does not include any of the following
extremities, and musculoskeletal soft tissues of the body
without the use of prescription drugs or surgery.
(A) Prescription or administration of legend drugs or other
controlled substances.
(B) Performing of incisive surgery or internal or externa

2	(C) Penetration of the skin with a needle or other instrument for
3	any purpose except for the purpose of blood analysis.
4	(D) Use of colonic irrigations, plasmatics, ionizing radiation
5	therapy, or radionics.
6	(E) Conducting invasive diagnostic tests or analysis of body fluids
7	except for urinalysis.
8	(F) The taking of x-rays of any organ other than the vertebral
9	column and extremities.
10	(G) The treatment or attempt to treat infectious diseases,
11	endocrine disorders, or atypical or abnormal histology.
12	(2) "Chiropractor" means any person who is qualified under this
13	chapter to practice the science of chiropractic.
14	(3) "Board" means the board of chiropractic examiners under
15	section 1.5 of this chapter.
16	(4) "Agency" refers to the Indiana professional licensing agency
17	under IC 25-1-5.
18	SECTION 2. IC 25-10-1-1.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.1-2006,
19	SECTION 428, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
20	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 1.5. (a) There is created a board of
21	chiropractic examiners. The board shall consist of seven (7) members
22	appointed by the governor, not more than four (4) of whom may be
23	affiliated with the same political party. Six (6) of the board members
24	must be licensed under this chapter and must have had at least five (5)
25	years of experience as a chiropractor prior to their appointment. One
26	(1) member is to represent the general public and must be:
27	(1) a resident of this state; and
28	(2) in no way associated with the profession of chiropractic other
29	than as a consumer.
30	(b) All members shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years and
31	serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. A vacancy
32	occurring on the board shall be filled by the governor by appointment.
33	Each appointed member shall serve for the unexpired term of the
34	vacating member.
35	(c) The members of the board are entitled to the minimum salary per
36	diem provided by IC 4-10-11-2.1(b). Members are also entitled to
37	reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under IC 4-13-1-4
38	and other expenses actually incurred in connection with the member's
39	duties as provided in the state policies and procedures established by
40	the Indiana department of administration and approved by the budget
41	agency.

(d) The members of the board shall organize by the election of a



chairman and a vice chairman from among its membership. The
officers serve for a term of one (1) year. The board shall meet at least
once each year and on other occasions as it considers necessary and
advisable. A meeting of the board may be called by its chairman or by
a majority of the members on the board. Four (4) members of the board
constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All decisions are
required to be made by a majority vote of the quorum.

- (e) The agency shall provide a secretary of the board and other personnel necessary for the proper performance of the board's duties and responsibilities under this chapter. The board, through the agency, shall receive and account for all money collected under this chapter and pay the money to the treasurer of state to be deposited by the treasurer in the general fund of the state.
 - (f) The board may do the following:
 - (1) Establish reasonable application, examination, and renewal procedures for certification under this chapter.
 - (2) Use an examination under this chapter that is designed by the board, designed by another person, or designed in part by the board and in part by another person.
 - (3) Conduct in the manner prescribed by the board examinations of applicants for certification under this chapter. The board may conduct any part of the examinations through a person other than the agency who is approved by the board. The agency may conduct any part of the examinations under IC 25-1-5-4.
 - (4) Issue, deny, suspend, revoke, and renew certificates.
 - (5) Subject to IC 25-1-7, investigate and conduct hearings, upon complaint against individuals certified or not certified under this chapter, concerning alleged violation of this chapter with hearings to be conducted in accordance with IC 4-21.5.
 - (6) Initiate the prosecution and enjoinder of a person violating this chapter.
 - (7) Adopt rules necessary for the proper performance of the board's duties, in accordance with IC 4-22-2.
 - (8) Maintain a current list of individuals certified under this chapter.
 - (9) Establish a code of professional conduct.
 - (10) Adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to allow chiropractors licensed under this chapter to delegate the manual manipulation, manual adjustment, or manual mobilization of the spinal column or the vertebral column under section 14(c)(4) of this chapter.
 - (11) Adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 establishing standards for the registration and regulation of chiropractic management



1	consultants (as defined by the board under IC 25-10-2).
2	(12) Set fees for the annual registration of a chiropractic
3	management consultant under IC 25-10-2.
4	(13) Adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 establishing health and
5	sanitation standards that conform to public health standards
6	for dry needling.
7	(g) The board shall adopt rules establishing standards for the
8	competent practice of the science of the chiropractic in accordance
9	with IC 4-22-2.
10	(h) All expenses incurred in the administration of this chapter shall
11	be paid from the state general fund upon appropriation being made in
12	the manner provided by law for the making of appropriations.
13	SECTION 3. IC 25-10-1-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
14	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 2. (a) A person who is
15	at least eighteen (18) years of age and who has not been convicted of
16	a crime that has a direct bearing on the person's ability to practice
17	competently is eligible to be licensed to practice chiropractic in Indiana
18	if the person is a graduate of an incorporated chiropractic school or
19	college incorporated for the purpose of teaching the science of
20	chiropractic. The school or college must:
21	(1) meet the reasonable requirements of the board; and must
22	(2) be accredited by the Accreditation Commission of the Council
23	on Chiropractic Education or its successor organization;
24	during the applicant's attendance at the accredited school or college.
25	The board may not discriminate against a chiropractic school or college
26	that meets these requirements.
27	(b) In addition to the requirements in subsection (a), an applicant for
28	a license to practice chiropractic must have completed:
29	(1) for applications made before July 1, 2021, at least two (2)
30	years sixty (60) semester hours; or
31	(2) for applications made after June 30, 2021, at least ninety
32	(90) semester hours;
33	of education in a college or university of learning accredited by an
34	accrediting agency that has been approved by the United States
35	Department of Education before the applicant's training and education
36	in a chiropractic school or college.
37	SECTION 4. IC 25-10-1-16 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
38	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
39	1, 2018]: Sec. 16. An individual may not use the title
40	"chiropractor" to indicate or imply that the individual is a
41	chiropractor unless the individual is licensed under this chapter.

SECTION 5. IC 25-10-1-17 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE

2	1, 2018]: Sec. 17. Except for the treatment of infectious and
3	endocrine diseases or atypical or abnormal histology, a

6	subluxations, fixations, and spinal intersegmental dysfunction,
7	through the following:
8	(1) The administration of chiropractic adjustment or
9	manipulation to the body for the purpose of maintaining,
10	restoring, or improving neurobiomechanical, immunological,
11	or physiological function.
12	(2) The administration or dispensing of supportive procedure
13	therapies, including physiological therapeutics, rehabilitation
14	procedures, and ancillary therapies.
15	(3) The use of solid filiform needles to treat
16	neuromusculoskeletal pain and dysfunction, which is
17	commonly referred to as dry needling, after completing board
18	approved continuing education and complying with applicable
19	board rules. However, a chiropractor may not engage in the

Page 5, delete lines 3 through 42.

Page 6, delete lines 1 through 5, begin a new paragraph and insert: "SECTION 5. IC 25-10-1-17 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 17. To the extent a therapy has been taught to a chiropractor in a chiropractic college or chiropractic program in a university that has been accredited by the Council of Chiropractic Education, its successor organization, or an approved postgraduate program, a chiropractor licensed under this article may treat injuries, conditions, and disorders, including chiropractic subluxations, fixations, spinal intersegmental dysfunction, or somatic dysfunctions, through the following:

- (1) The administration of chiropractic adjustment or manipulation to the body for the purpose of maintaining, restoring, or improving neurobiomechanical or physiological function.
- (2) The administration or dispensing of supportive procedure therapies, including physiological therapeutics, rehabilitation procedures, and ancillary therapies.
- (3) The use of solid filiform needles to treat neuromusculoskeletal pain and dysfunction, which is commonly referred to as dry needling. However, a chiropractor may not engage in the practice of acupuncture (as defined in IC 25-2.5-1-5), unless the chiropractor is licensed under IC 25-2.5.
- (4) The performance of any other therapeutic procedure or service that is not beyond the chiropractor's education and training, including the ordering of advanced imaging and x-rays.
- (5) The evaluation and examination of individuals to determine the presence of, absence of, and diagnosis of physical or physiologic injuries, conditions, or disorders of the body.
- (6) The performance of an analysis to detect chiropractic subluxations, fixations, spinal intersegmental dysfunctions, or somatic dysfunctions.
- (7) The management, coordination, or delegation of patient



care functions, including initiating referrals to specialists for concurrent, additional, or alternative services or care the chiropractor believes is most suited for the individual's chiropractic condition.

- (8) Counseling and instructing individuals regarding general health matters, including activities of daily living, diet, weight management, ergonomics, exercise, hygiene, nutrition, risk factor screening, wellness, and good health habits.
- (9) Ordering, performing, and interpreting laboratory, radiological, electrodiagnostic, or any other diagnostic studies, including x-ray studies and advanced imaging of all parts of the human body."
