



HOUSE BILL No. 1387

DIGEST OF HB 1387 (Updated January 30, 2014 3:08 pm - DI 110)

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3; IC 7.1-5.

Synopsis: Farm winery direct sales to a retailer or dealer. Allows a farm winery permittee to sell not more than a total of 5,000 gallons of wine during a permittee to sell not more than a total of 5,000 gallons of wine during a permit year to a holder of a wine retailer's permit or a wine dealer's permit if the wine retailer's or wine dealer's licensed premises is located within the same county as the licensed premises of the farm winery or a county contiguous to that county. Requires that, if any provision of the law allowing farm winery permittees to sell to wine retailers and wine dealers is held invalid, the remaining provisions of that law must be construed in accordance with the intent of the legislature to further limit rather than to expend commerce in of the legislature to further limit rather than to expand commerce in alcoholic beverages and to enhance strict regulatory control through the alcohol and tobacco commission and the three tier system of alcoholic beverage distribution

HOUSE BILL No. 1387

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-12-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.186-2011,
2	SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 5. (a) The holder of a farm winery permit:
4	(1) is entitled to manufacture wine and to bottle wine produced by
5	the permit holder's farm winery;
6	(2) is entitled to serve complimentary samples of the winery's
7	wine on the licensed premises or an outside area that is
8	contiguous to the licensed premises as approved by the
9	commission if each employee who serves wine on the licensed
10	premises:
11	(A) holds an employee permit under IC 7.1-3-18-9; and
12	(B) completes a server training program approved by the
13	commission;
14	(3) is entitled to sell the winery's wine on the licensed premises to
15	consumers either by the glass, or by the bottle, or both;
16	(4) is entitled to sell the winery's wine to consumers by the bottle



l	at a farmers' market that is operated on a nonprofit basis;
2	(5) is entitled to sell wine by the bottle or by the case to a person
3	who is the holder of a permit issued under IC 7.1-3-13 to sell
4	wine at wholesale;
5	(6) is entitled to sell not more than a total of five thousand
6	(5,000) gallons of wine, by the bottle or by the case, during a
7	permit year to a holder of a:
8	(A) wine retailer's permit issued under IC 7.1-3-14 if the

20	(6) (7) is exempt from the provisions of IC 7.1-3-14;
21	(7) (8) is entitled to advertise the name and address of any retailer
22	or dealer who sells wine produced by the permit holder's winery;
23	(8) (9) for wine described in IC 7.1-1-2-3(a)(4):
24	(A) may allow transportation to and consumption of the wine
25	on the licensed premises; and
26	(B) may not sell, offer to sell, or allow the sale of the wine on
27	the licensed premises;
28	(9) (10) is entitled to purchase and sell bulk wine as set forth in
29	this chapter;
30	(10) (11) is entitled to sell wine as authorized by this section for
31	carryout on Sunday; and
32	(11) (12) is entitled to sell and ship the farm winery's wine to a
33	person located in another state in accordance with the laws of the
34	other state.
35	(b) If any provision of subsection (a)(6) or its application to any
36	person or circumstance is held invalid, the remaining provisions of
37	subsection (a)(6) must be construed in accordance with the intent
38	of the general assembly to further limit rather than to expand
39	commerce in alcoholic beverages and to enhance strict regulatory
40	control through the commission and the three (3) tier system of
41	alcoholic beverage distribution.
42	(b) (c) With the approval of the commission, a holder of a permit



under this chapter may conduct business at not more than three (3) additional locations that are separate from the winery. At the additional locations, the holder of a permit may conduct any business that is authorized at the first location, except for the manufacturing or bottling of wine.

(c) (d) With the approval of the commission, a holder of a permit under this chapter may, individually or with other permit holders under this chapter, participate in a trade show or an exposition at which products of each permit holder participant are displayed, promoted, and sold. The commission may not grant approval under this subsection to a holder of a permit under this chapter for more than forty-five (45) days in a calendar year.

SECTION 2. IC 7.1-5-11-1.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.165-2006, SECTION 38, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 1.5. (a) Except as provided in **IC 7.1-3-12-5 and** IC 7.1-3-26, it is unlawful for a person in the business of selling alcoholic beverages in Indiana or outside Indiana to ship or cause to be shipped an alcoholic beverage directly to a person in Indiana who does not hold a valid wholesaler permit under this title. This includes the ordering and selling of alcoholic beverages over a computer network (as defined by IC 35-43-2-3(a)).

- (b) Upon a determination by the commission that a person has violated subsection (a), a wholesaler may not accept a shipment of alcoholic beverages from the person for a period of up to one (1) year as determined by the commission.
- (c) The commission shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement this section.

HOUSE MOTION

Mr. Speaker: I move that House Bill 1387 be amended to read as follows:

Page 2, delete lines 5 through 9, begin a new line block indented and insert:

- "(6) is entitled to sell not more than a total of five thousand (5,000) gallons of wine, by the bottle or by the case, during a permit year to a holder of a:
 - (A) wine retailer's permit issued under IC 7.1-3-14 if the wine retailer's premises is located:
 - (i) within the same county as the licensed premises of the farm winery where the wine is manufactured; or
 - (ii) within a county contiguous to the county described in item (i); or
 - (B) wine dealer's permit issued under IC 7.1-3-15 if the wine dealer's premises is located:
 - (i) within the same county as the licensed premises of the farm winery where the wine is manufactured; or
 - (ii) within a county contiguous to the county described in item (i);".
- Page 2, between lines 24 and 25, begin a new paragraph and insert:
- "(b) If any provision of subsection (a)(6) or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remaining provisions of subsection (a)(6) must be construed in accordance with the intent of the general assembly to further limit rather than to expand commerce in alcoholic beverages and to enhance strict regulatory



control through the commission and the three (3) tier system of alcoholic beverage distribution.".

Page 2, line 25, strike "(b)" and insert "(c)".

Page 2, line 30, strike "(c)" and insert "(d)".
