HOUSE BILL No. 1389

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law and juvenile law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 33-37-4-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.85-2017, SECTION 110, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 3. (a) **Except as provided in subsection (d)**, the clerk shall collect a juvenile costs fee of one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) for each action filed under any of the following:

- (1) IC 31-34 (children in need of services).
 - (2) IC 31-37 (delinquent children).
- (3) IC 31-14 (paternity).

10 (b) **Except as provided in subsection (d),** in addition to the 11 juvenile costs fee collected under this section, the clerk shall collect the 12 following fees, if they are required under IC 33-37-5:

13 (1) A document fee (IC 33-37-5-1, IC 33-37-5-3, or 14 IC 33-37-5-4).

- 15 (2) A marijuana eradication program fee (IC 33-37-5-7).
- 16 (3) An alcohol and drug services program fee (IC 33-37-5-8(b)).
- 17 (4) A law enforcement continuing education program fee (IC
