DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 2-5-48.

Synopsis: Task force to combat racism as a health crisis. Establishes the task force to combat racism as a public health crisis (task force). Specifies the duties of the task force. Requires the task force to make recommendations to the general assembly and the governor: (1) concerning policies and programs that combat racism and mitigate the effects of racism on individual and public health; and (2) identifying appropriate funding for the policies and programs recommended by the task force. Requires the task force to issue a report before November 1, 2022.

Effective: Upon passage.

HOUSE BILL No. 1390

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning the general assembly.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 2-5-48 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON
3	PASSAGE]:
4	Chapter 48. Task Force to Combat Racism as a Public Health
5	Crisis
6	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "task force" refers to the task
7	force to combat racism as a public health crisis established by
8	section 2 of this chapter.
9	Sec. 2. The task force to combat racism as a public health crisis
10	is established.
11	Sec. 3. The task force consists of the following fifteen (15)
12	members:
13	(1) Four (4) members of the house of representatives,
14	appointed as follows:
15	(A) Two (2) members appointed by the speaker, one (1) of
16	whom shall serve as co-chair of the task force.
17	(B) Two (2) members appointed by the minority leader.



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1	(2) Four (4) members of the senate, appointed as follows:
2	(A) Two (2) members appointed by the president pro
3	tempore, one (1) of whom shall serve as co-chair of the task
4	force.
5	(B) Two (2) members appointed by the minority leader.
6	(3) The secretary of family and social services or the
7	secretary's designee.
8	(4) The state health commissioner or the commissioner's
9	designee.
10	(5) One (1) member representing the Indiana Minority Health
11	Coalition appointed by the speaker.
12	(6) One (1) member representing the Health and Hospital
13	Corporation of Marion County appointed by the minority
14	leader of the house of representatives.
15	(7) One (1) member representing the Indiana State Medical
16	Association appointed by the president pro tempore.
17	(8) One (1) member representing the Indiana Hospital
18	Association appointed by the minority leader of the senate.
19	(9) One (1) member with broad experience in health care
20	policy appointed by the governor.
21	Sec. 4. (a) Eight (8) members of the task force constitute a
22	quorum.
23	(b) The affirmative vote of at least a majority of the members at
24	a meeting at which a quorum is present is necessary for the task
25	force to take official action other than to meet and take testimony.
26	(c) The task force shall meet at the call of the co-chairs.
27	Sec. 5. All meetings of the task force must be open to the public
28	in accordance with and subject to IC 5-14-1.5. All records of the
29	task force are subject to the requirements of IC 5-14-3.
30	Sec. 6. The task force shall do the following:
31	(1) Promote community engagement and identify tools for
32	government agencies to engage actively and authentically with
33	communities of color to combat racism as a public health
34	crisis.
35	(2) Encourage community leaders and stakeholders in the
36	areas of education, employment, housing, criminal justice,
37	and safety to recognize racism as a public health crisis and
38	take appropriate action.
39	(3) Promote racially equitable economic and workforce
40	development in Indiana.
41	(4) Promote and encourage all policies that prioritize the

health of people of color.



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1	(5) Identify and promote policies and programs that mitigate
2	exposure to adverse childhood experiences and trauma and
3	expand understanding of racism and the effects of racism on
4	individual and public health.
5	(6) Identify and recommend budgetary priorities that secure
6	adequate resources to fund the ongoing efforts of state and
7	local government to combat racism as a public health crisis.
8	Sec. 7. The task force shall make recommendations to the
9	general assembly and the governor:
10	(1) concerning policies and programs that combat racism and
11	mitigate the effects of racism on individual and public health;
12	and
13	(2) identifying appropriate funding for the policies and
14	programs recommended by the task force.
15	Sec. 8. (a) Before November 1, 2022, the task force shall issue a
16	report setting forth the recommendations required by section 7 of
17	this chapter to the following:
18	(1) The executive director of the legislative services agency for
19	distribution to the members of the general assembly.
20	(2) The governor.
21	(3) The state department of health.
22	(4) The family social services administration.
23	(b) The report submitted to the executive director of the
24	legislative services agency under subsection (a) must be in an
25	electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
26	Sec. 9. The legislative services agency shall provide staff support
27	to the task force.
28	Sec. 10. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the task force
29	is subject to the rules and policies of the legislative council
30	governing the operation of interim study committees under
31	IC 2-5-1.3.
32	(b) The task force may meet as often as necessary in the 2021
33	and 2022 interims to fulfill its duties under this chapter.
34	Sec. 11. This chapter expires December 31, 2022.
35	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
