# HOUSE BILL No. 1391

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

#### Citations Affected: IC 20-34-3-12.

**Synopsis:** Comprehensive eye exams in school. Provides that the vision test for students in kindergarten and grade 1 shall be a comprehensive eye exam. Provides criteria for a comprehensive eye exam. Requires a comprehensive eye exam to be performed at the office of a licensed ophthalmologist or licensed optometrist. Makes conforming changes.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

### HOUSE BILL No. 1391

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

#### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-34-3-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.89-2013,
2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 12. (a) For purposes of this section, "modified
4	clinical technique" "comprehensive eye exam" means a battery of
5	vision tests that includes the following:
6	(1) A comprehensive patient history.
7	(2) Preliminary testing procedures, including pupil testing and
8	an evaluation of an individual's eye to determine the
9	individual's:
10	(A) depth perception;
11	(B) color vision;
12	(C) eye muscle movements; and
13	(D) peripheral vision.
14	(3) A visual acuity test to determine an individual's ability to see
15	at various distances.
16	(2) (4) A refractive error test to determine the focusing power of
17	the eye.



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1	(3) (5) An ocular health test to determine any external or internal
2	abnormalities or disease of the eye. and
3	(4) (6) A binocular coordination test to determine if the eyes are
4	working together properly.
5	(7) Eye focusing, eye teaming, and eye movement testing to
6	determine how the eyes focus, move, and work together.
7	(8) A topography or keratometry to measure the curvature of
8	the cornea.
9	(9) Any additional testing necessary to clarify the result of a
10	test described in subdivisions (2) through (8).
11	(b) For purposes of this section, "vision screening" means the testing
12	of visual acuity to determine an individual's ability to see at various
13	distances using:
14	(1) the Snellen chart;
15	(2) Sloan letters;
16	(3) HOTV; or
17	(4) LEA symbol optotypes;
18	at a distance of either ten (10) or twenty (20) feet for distance vision,
19	depending on the calibration of the chart being used, and a distance of
20	fourteen (14) inches for near vision.
21	(c) The modified elinical technique comprehensive eye exam shall
22	be performed:
23	(1) by an ophthalmologist licensed as a physician under
24	IC 25-22.5 or an optometrist licensed under IC 25-24; and
25	(2) at the office of a licensed ophthalmologist or licensed
26	optometrist.
27	(d) The governing body of each school corporation shall conduct a
28	vision test for each student enrolling in or transferring into:
29	(1) either kindergarten or grade 1;
30	(2) grade 3;
31	(3) grade 5; and
32	(4) grade 8;
33	and for each student suspected of having a visual defect.
34	(e) The vision test for students in kindergarten and grade 1 shall be
35	conducted using the modified clinical technique a comprehensive eye
36	exam unless a waiver is granted under section 13 of this chapter. If a
37	waiver is granted for a school corporation, the governing body shall
38	conduct a vision screening upon each student's enrollment in
39	kindergarten or grade 1.
40	(f) Each student described in subsection $(d)(2)$ , $(d)(3)$ , and $(d)(4)$ ,
41	and each student suspected of having a visual defect shall be tested
42	using a vision screening of the student's visual acuity.



1 (g) The following standards apply for a vision screening under 2 subsections (e) and (f): 3 (1) A student in kindergarten or grade 1 who is unable to read 4 with each eye the 20/30 line of the Snellen chart or the 20/32 line 5 of the Sloan letters, HOTV, or LEA symbol optotypes shall be 6 recommended for further examination based upon the 7 recommendation of the individual performing the screening. 8 (2) A student: 9 (A) in grade 3, grade 5, or grade 8; or (B) suspected of having a visual defect; 10 who is unable to read with each eye the 20/30 line of the Snellen 11 chart or the 20/32 line of the Sloan letters shall be recommended 12 for further examination based upon the recommendation of the 13 14 individual performing the screening. 15 (h) Records of all tests shall be made and continuously maintained by the school corporation to provide information useful in protecting, 16 promoting, and maintaining the health of students. The state Indiana 17 department of health and the state board shall adopt joint rules 18 19 concerning vision testing equipment, qualifications of vision testing 20 personnel, visual screening procedures, and criteria for failure and 21 referral in the screening tests based on accepted medical practice and 22 standards. 23 (i) The school corporation's governing body and the superintendent 24 shall receive annually the following information concerning the tests 25 conducted under this section: (1) The number of students tested by grade. 26 27 (2) The number of students by grade who were tested using the 28 modified clinical technique. received a comprehensive eve 29 exam. 30 (3) The number of students by grade who were tested using a 31 vision screening. 32 (4) The number of students by grade who passed a test. 33 (5) The number of students by grade who failed a test or were 34 referred for further testing. 35 (6) The name of the individual or department that supervised the 36 testing. 37 (j) Each school corporation shall annually provide to the 38 department, for each school within the school corporation, the 39 following information concerning the tests conducted under this 40 section: 41 (1) the number of students tested by grade; 42 (2) the number of students by grade who were tested using the

3	(3) the number of students by grade who were tested using a
4	vision screening;
5	(4) the number of students who passed a test by grade; and
6	(5) the number of students who failed a test or who were referred
7	for further testing.
8	(k) Not later than October 1 each year, the department shall report
9	for the previous school year:
10	(1) a compilation of the information received from school
11	corporations under subsection (j);
12	(2) information received under section 13 of this chapter,
13	including:
14	(A) the number of school corporations that applied for a
15	waiver;
16	(B) the number of waivers approved;
17	(C) the number of waivers denied;
18	(D) the name of each school corporation that applied for a
19	waiver and whether the waiver was approved or denied; and
20	(E) the reason for the approval or denial;
21	(3) the total number of students eligible for testing; and
22	(4) the total number of students tested;
23	to the legislative council in electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
