## **HOUSE BILL No. 1394**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 8-23-5.5; IC 9-13-2; IC 9-21-5-11.

**Synopsis:** Highway work zone safety. Requires the state police and the department of transportation to establish a pilot program for the deployment of an automated work zone speed control system to enforce highway work zone speed limits. Provides that a work zone speed limit violation recorded by an automated work zone speed control system may not be enforced unless the violation is at least 12 miles per hour above the established work zone speed limit. Creates the highway work zone pilot fund.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

### **HOUSE BILL No. 1394**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning transportation and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 8-23-5.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A <b>NEW</b> CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

4	Chapter 5.5. Automated Work Zone Speed Enforcement Pilot
5	Program
6	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "highway work zone" has the
7	meaning set forth in IC 8-23-2-15.
8	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "owner" means:
9	(1) the registered owner of a motor vehicle; or
10	(2) a person leasing a motor vehicle under a lease agreement
11	for a period of at least six (6) months.
12	The term does not include a motor vehicle rental or leasing
13	company.
14	Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "pilot fund" refers to the
15	highway work zone pilot fund established by section 19 of this
16	chapter.
17	Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "pilot program" refers to the

16	Sec. 6. As used in this chapter, "work zone speed control

20	predetermined speed in or approaching a highway work zone.
21	Sec. 7. As used in this chapter, "work zone speed control system
22	operator" means an individual who is:
23	(1) trained and certified to operate a work zone speed control
24	system; and
25	(2) a state police officer or an employee of the department.
26	Sec. 8. As used in this chapter, "work zone speed limit" means
27	a temporary speed limit posted in the vicinity of a worksite under
28	IC 9-21-5-11.
29	Sec. 9. (a) The department and the state police department shall
30	jointly establish a pilot program for the deployment of work zone
31	speed control systems.
32	(b) The department and the state police department may enter
33	into an agreement to share information to implement this chapter.
34	(c) The department may enter into an agreement with a third
35	party vendor to assist in the administration of this chapter.
36	Sec. 10. (a) A maximum of four (4) work zone speed control
37	systems may be deployed at any particular time under the pilot
38	program.
39	(b) Subject to section 11 of this chapter, a work zone speed
40	control system may be used under the pilot program to record
41	images of motor vehicles traveling on a highway if all of the



following apply:

1	(1) The work zone speed control system is deployed within a
2	highway work zone.
3	(2) The highway work zone is located on a freeway.
4	expressway, or controlled access highway that has a speed
5	limit of at least forty-five (45) miles per hour when there is not
6	a work zone speed limit.
7	(3) Workers are present in the immediate vicinity of the
8	highway work zone.
9	(4) The work zone speed control system is operated by a work
10	zone speed control system operator.
11	(5) A conspicuous road sign alerting drivers that a work zone
12	speed control system may be used to enforce the work zone
13	speed limit is placed in a location before the beginning of the
14	highway work zone in accordance with national traffic safety
15	guidelines.
16	Sec. 11. (a) Only recorded images of motor vehicles traveling at
17	least twelve (12) miles per hour above the work zone speed limit
18	may be retained and used to enforce the work zone speed limit
19	under this chapter.
20	(b) Except as provided in subsection (a), use of a recorded image
21	for the purpose of enforcing a traffic offense under IC 9-13-2-183
22	is prohibited.
23	Sec. 12. (a) An individual must complete training by the
24	manufacturer of the work zone speed control system in the
25	procedures for deploying, testing, and operating the work zone
26	speed control system to become a work zone speed control system
27	operator.
28	(b) The manufacturer shall issue a certificate of training to the
29	individual upon the individual's completion of the training.
30	Sec. 13. A work zone speed control system operator shall
31	complete and sign a daily log for a work zone speed control system
32	that records:
33	(1) the:
34	(A) date;
35	(B) time; and
36	(C) location of the deployment of the work zone speed
37	control system; and
38	(2) a statement that the work zone speed control system
39	operator:
40	(A) successfully performed the manufacturer specified
41	tests of the work zone speed control system; and

(B) the device passed the manufacturer specified tests of

3	Sec. 14. (a) A work zone speed control system must undergo an
4	annual calibration check performed by an independent calibration
5	laboratory.
6	(b) The laboratory performing the calibration check shall issue
7	a certificate of calibration to the department.
8	Sec. 15. (a) Except as provided in section 18 of this chapter, the
9	owner of a motor vehicle traveling at least twelve (12) miles per
10	hour in excess of a work zone speed limit, as recorded by a work
11	zone speed control system deployed under this chapter, is liable for
12	a fine of seventy-five dollars (\$75).
13	(b) If the owner of a motor vehicle is relieved from liability
14	under section 18 of this chapter, the operator of a motor vehicle
15	traveling at least twelve (12) miles per hour in excess of a work
16	zone speed limit, as recorded by a work zone speed control system
17	deployed under this chapter, is liable for the fine of seventy-five
18	dollars (\$75).
19	Sec. 16. (a) A work zone speed control system operator shall
20	mail a citation to the owner of a motor vehicle recorded traveling
21	at least twelve (12) miles per hour in excess of a work zone speed
22	limit. The citation must include the following information:
23	(1) The name and address of the registered owner of the
24	motor vehicle.
25	(2) The registration number of the motor vehicle.
26	(3) A statement that the owner of the motor vehicle is being
27	charged with violating a work zone speed limit.
28	(4) The location of the violation of the work zone speed limit.
29	(5) The date and time of the violation of the work zone speed
30	limit.
31	(6) At least one (1) recorded image of the motor vehicle with
32	a data bar imprinted on each image that includes the speed of
33	the vehicle and the date and time that the image was recorded.
34	(7) A statement that the fine for violating the work zone speed
35	limit when the violation is detected by a work zone speed
36	control system is seventy-five dollars (\$75).
37	(8) The date by which the fine must be paid.
38	(9) A signed statement by a police officer employed by the
39	state police department that the police officer has:
40	(A) reviewed the recorded images; and
41	(B) determined that the motor vehicle was traveling at

16	under this section may:

19	(2) contest the liability alleged by the citation in the manner
20	specified by the citation in the appropriate circuit, superior,
21	or traffic court.
22	Sec. 17. (a) A certificate:
23	(1) alleging that a violation of a work zone speed limit
24	occurred and was detected by a work zone speed control
25	system;
26	(2) stating that the work zone speed control system was
27	deployed and operated in the manner required under this
28	chapter;
29	(3) stating that a police officer employed by the state police
30	department has reviewed the recorded images obtained by the
31	work zone speed control system to determine that the
32	violation of the work zone speed limit occurred; and
33	(4) signed and affirmed by the police officer described in
34	subdivision (3);
35	is evidence of the facts contained in the certificate.
36	(b) The certificate is admissible in a proceeding conducted
37	under this chapter without requiring the presence or testimony of
38	the appropriate work zone speed control system operator.

13	Sec. 18. (a) A circuit, superior, or traffic court conducting a
14	proceeding under this chapter shall determine a person's liability
15	for an alleged violation of a work zone speed limit based on the
16	preponderance of the evidence.
17	(b) A circuit, superior, or traffic court conducting a proceeding
18	to contest the liability alleged in a citation issued under section 16
19	of this chapter may consider any of the following in a defense of an
20	alleged violation of a work zone speed limit:
21	(1) That the motor vehicle or the registration plate of the
22	motor vehicle detected by the work zone speed control system
23	had been stolen before the violation occurred and was not
24	under the control or possession of the person receiving the
25	citation under section 16 of this chapter at the time of the
26	alleged violation.
27	(2) Subject to subsection (c), that the owner of the motor
28	vehicle detected by the work zone speed control system was
29	not operating the motor vehicle at the time of the alleged
30	violation.
31	(3) Any other relevant information presented to the court.
32	(c) To satisfy the evidentiary burden of establishing a defense
33	described in subsection (b)(2), the owner of a motor vehicle must
34	submit to the court a sworn affidavit stating that the person was
35	not operating the motor vehicle at the time of the alleged work
36	zone speed limit violation. The owner must include in the sworn
37	affidavit any corroborating evidence that the owner was not
38	operating the motor vehicle at the time of the alleged violation and
39	any relevant evidence identifying the operator of the motor vehicle
40	at the time of the alleged violation.
41	(d) If the court finds that the owner of the motor vehicle

detected by the work zone speed control system was not operating

1	the motor vehicle at the time of the alleged violation and receives
2	evidence identifying the operator of the motor vehicle at the time
3	of the alleged violation, the court shall provide to the state police
4	department the evidence substantiating who was operating the
5	motor vehicle at the time of the alleged violation.
6	(e) Upon receipt of evidence substantiating who was operating
7	the motor vehicle at the time of the alleged violation, the state
8	police department may issue a citation to the operator of the motor
9	vehicle containing the following information:
10	(1) The name and address of the individual identified as the
11	operator of the motor vehicle.
12	(2) A description of the motor vehicle, including the name of
13	the owner of the motor vehicle.
14	(3) A statement that the individual is being charged with
15	violating a work zone speed limit as the operator of the motor
16	vehicle.
17	(4) The location of the violation of the work zone speed limit.
18	(5) The date and time of the violation of the work zone speed
19	limit.
20	(6) At least one (1) recorded image of the motor vehicle with
21	a data bar imprinted on each image that includes the speed of
22	the vehicle and the date and time that the image was recorded.
23	(7) A statement that the fine for violating the work zone speed
23 24 25	limit when the violation is detected by a work zone speed
25	control system is seventy-five dollars (\$75).
26	(8) The date by which the fine must be paid.
27	(9) A signed statement by a police officer employed by the
28	state police department that the police officer has:
29	(A) reviewed the recorded images; and
30	(B) determined that the motor vehicle was traveling at
31	least twelve (12) miles per hour in excess of the work zone
32	speed limit.
33	(10) A statement that the recorded images obtained through
34	a work zone speed control system are evidence of a work zone
35	speed limit violation.
36	(11) A statement advising the individual of the manner and
37	time in which the liability alleged in the citation may be
38	contested in the appropriate circuit, superior, or traffic court.
39	(f) A citation issued under subsection (e) must be mailed not
40	later than thirty (30) days after the date the state police
41	department receives the information described in subsection (d).
42	(g) The operator of a motor vehicle who receives a citation



1	issued under this section may:
2	(1) pay the fine imposed before the deadline specified by the
3	citation; or
4	(2) contest the liability alleged by the citation in the manner
5	specified by the citation in the appropriate circuit, superior,
6	or traffic court.
7	(h) A circuit, superior, or traffic court conducting a proceeding
8	to contest the liability alleged in a citation issued under subsection
9	(e) may consider any of the following in a defense of an alleged
10	violation of a work zone speed limit:
11	(1) Subject to subsection (i), that the individual was not
12	operating the motor vehicle at the time of the alleged
13	violation.
14	(2) Any other relevant information presented to the court.
15	(i) To satisfy the evidentiary burden of establishing a defense
16	described in subsection (h)(1), the individual shall submit to the
17	court a sworn affidavit stating that the person was not operating
18	the motor vehicle at the time of the alleged work zone speed limit
19	violation. The individual must include in the sworn affidavit any
20	corroborating evidence that the individual was not operating the
21	motor vehicle at the time of the alleged violation and any relevant
22	evidence identifying the operator of the motor vehicle at the time
23	of the alleged violation.
24	Sec. 19. (a) The highway work zone pilot fund is established for
25	the purpose of promoting and developing work zone safety under
26	the pilot program established under this chapter.
27	(b) The fund consists of all fines collected under this chapter and
28	shall be distributed as follows:
29	(1) Forty percent (40%) to the state police department, with
30	fifty percent (50%) allocated for recruiting, training, or
31	equipping cadets, and fifty percent (50%) allocated for
32	increased police presence in highway work zones.
33	(2) Forty percent (40%) to the department, to be allocated for
34	hiring off duty law enforcement officers who will function as
35	work zone speed control system operators as described in this
36	chapter.
37	(3) Twenty percent (20%) to the department, to be allocated
38	for improving highway work zone safety.
39	(c) The department shall administer the fund.
40	(d) The expenses of administering the fund must be paid from
41	money in the fund.
42	(e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not



1	revert to the state general fund.
2	(f) The money in the fund is continually appropriated to the
3	department to fund the purposes specified in this chapter.
4	Sec. 20. Before September 1, 2024, the department shall submit
5	a report to the legislative council in an electronic format under
6	IC 5-14-6 detailing the costs incurred under the pilot program, the
7	amount of fines collected under the pilot program, and the impact
8	of the pilot program on highway work zone safety.
9	SECTION 2. IC 9-13-2-73.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
10	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
11	1, 2022]: Sec. 73.5. "Highway work zone" has the meaning set forth
12	in IC 8-23-2-15.
13	SECTION 3. IC 9-13-2-202 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
14	AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
15	1, 2022]: Sec. 202. "Work zone speed control system" has the
16	meaning set forth in IC 8-23-5.5-6.
17	SECTION 4. IC 9-21-5-11, AS AMENDED BY P.L.41-2016,
18	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
19	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 11. (a) Subject to subsection (b), the Indiana
20	department of transportation, the Indiana finance authority, or a local
21	authority may establish temporary maximum speed limits in their
22	respective jurisdictions and in the vicinity of a worksite without
23	conducting an engineering study and investigation required under this
24	article. The establishing authority shall post signs notifying the
25	traveling public of the temporary maximum speed limits established
26	under this section.
27	(b) Worksite speed limits set under this section must be at least ten
28	(10) miles per hour below the maximum established speed limit.
29	(c) A worksite speed limit set under this section may be enforced
30	only if: as follows:
31	(1) If workers are present in the immediate vicinity of the
32	worksite. <del>or</del>
33	(2) If workers are not present in the immediate vicinity of the
34	worksite, the establishing authority determines that the safety of
35	the traveling public requires enforcement of the worksite speed
36	limit.
37	(3) In the case of a speed limit in a highway work zone
38	enforced by a work zone speed control system under
39	IC 8-23-5.5, if:
40	(A) workers are present in the immediate vicinity of the
41	highway work zone; and

(B) the work zone speed control system indicates that the

1	operator of a motor vehicle has exceeded the work zone
2	speed limit set under this section by at least twelve (12)
3	miles per hour.
4	(d) This subsection does not apply to a person whose violation
5	of a work zone speed limit is detected and enforced using a work
6	zone speed control system under IC 8-23-5.5. Notwithstanding
7	IC 34-28-5-4(b), a judgment for the infraction of violating a speed limit
8	set under this section must be entered as follows:
9	(1) If the person has not previously committed the infraction of
10	violating a speed limit set under this section, a judgment for a
11	Class B infraction and a fine of at least three hundred dollars
12	(\$300) shall be imposed.
13	(2) If the person has committed one (1) infraction of violating a
14	speed limit set under this section in the previous three (3) years,
15	a judgment for a Class B infraction and a fine of at least five
16	hundred dollars (\$500) shall be imposed.
17	(3) If the person has committed two (2) or more infractions of
18	violating a speed limit set under this section in the previous three
19	(3) years, a judgment for a Class B infraction and a fine of one
20	thousand dollars (\$1,000) shall be imposed.
21	(e) This subsection does not apply to person whose violation of
22	a work zone speed limit is detected and enforced using a work zone
23	speed control system under IC 8-23-5.5. Notwithstanding
24	IC 34-28-5-5(c), the funds collected as judgments for the infraction of
25	violating a speed limit set under this section shall be transferred to the
26	Indiana department of transportation to pay the costs of hiring off duty
27	police officers to perform the duties described in IC 8-23-2-15(b).
28	(f) This subsection does not apply to person whose violation of
29	a work zone speed limit is detected and enforced using a work zone
30	speed control system under IC 8-23-5.5. If judgment has been
31	imposed for committing two (2) infractions under this section within
32	one (1) year, an additional penalty of the suspension of the driving
33	privileges of the person who committed the infractions may be imposed
34	by the court imposing the sentence for the second violation. If the court
35	suspends a person's driving privileges under this subsection, the court
36	shall issue an order to the bureau:
37	(1) stating that judgment against the person has been entered for
38	committing the infraction of exceeding a worksite speed limit
39	under this section for the second time in one (1) year; and
40	(2) ordering the suspension of the person's driving privileges by
41	the bureau under IC 9-30-13-9.
42	The suspension of a person's driving privileges under this section is in



- addition to any other penalties imposed under this section and any fee imposed under IC 33-37-5-14.
