DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-28-13.

Synopsis: National board certification of teachers. Establishes the goal that by 2025, there will be at least one teacher who is certified by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (national board) in every public school. Establishes the teachers' national board certification incentive fund for purposes of: (1) funding stipends of \$200 per day for two days for teachers preparing for national board certification; (2) reimbursing 75% of the national board certification fee; (3) funding stipends for national board certified teachers who serve as mentors to other teachers; (4) reimbursing school corporations for the cost of paying teachers who have attained national board certification as of July 1, 2013, or thereafter an annual salary supplement of \$2,000 for the life of the certificate; and (5) reimbursing school corporations for the cost of employing substitute teachers for teachers who are national board certification candidates. Requires a school corporation to allow a teacher pursuing national board certification at least five days of released time during the school year.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

HOUSE BILL No. 1412

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

5	Sec. 1. The general assembly establishes a goal that by 2025

8	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the teachers'
9	national board certification incentive fund established by section
10	6 of this chapter.
11	Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "mentor" means a highly skilled,
12	experienced teacher who provides systematic and ongoing support
13	and assistance to other teachers in a school or school corporation
14	to help the other teachers improve their teaching skills and
15	practices.
16	Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "national board" refers to the



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National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, a 1 2 nonpartisan, independent, and nonprofit board composed of 3 teachers and others that: 4 (1) has developed a set of standards for teachers; and 5 (2) operates a national voluntary system to assess and certify 6 teachers who meet the board's standards. 7 Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "national board certification" 8 means a demonstration by an experienced teacher of the teacher's 9 teaching practice as measured against the standards of the national 10 board through an assessment process administered by the national 11 board. Sec. 6. (a) The teachers' national board certification incentive 12 13 fund is established for the following purposes: 14 (1) Funding stipends under section 7 of this chapter for 15 teachers preparing for certification by the national board. 16 (2) Reimbursing part of the certification fee under section 11 17 of this chapter to each teacher who is awarded national board 18 certification. 19 (3) Funding stipends under section 12 of this chapter for 20 national board certified teachers who serve as mentors to 21 other teachers within the school corporation. 22 (4) Reimbursing school corporations under section 13 of this 23 chapter for salary supplements paid to national board 24 certified teachers. 25 (5) Reimbursing school corporations under section 14 of this 26 chapter for persons who serve as substitute teachers for 27 national board certification candidates. 28 (b) The fund consists of appropriations to the fund and gifts, 29 grants, devises, or bequests made to the state to achieve the 30 purposes of the fund. 31 (c) The department shall administer the fund. 32 (d) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from 33 money in the fund. The treasurer of state shall invest the money in 34 the fund not currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund 35 in the same manner as other public money may be invested. 36 Interest that accrues from these investments shall be deposited in 37 the fund. 38 (e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not 39 revert to the state general fund. 40 (f) Money in the fund is appropriated continuously for the 41 purposes specified in this section. 42 Sec. 7. A teacher who is:



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(1) employed by a school corporation; and

(2) pursuing national board certification;

is entitled to receive from the fund a stipend of two hundred dollars (\$200) per day for two (2) days beyond the school contract year for preparing for the certification assessments.

Sec. 8. A school corporation shall allow at least five (5) days of paid released time during the school year for a teacher pursuing national board certification.

9 Sec. 9. A school corporation may, at its own expense, provide
10 paid released time for teachers pursuing national board
11 certification in addition to the paid released time required under
12 section 8 of this chapter.

Sec. 10. If a teacher does not successfully complete all
assessments required for national board certification during a
school year, the provisions in this chapter may be applied to a
second school year for that teacher.

17Sec. 11. A teacher who attains national board certification after18June 30, 2014, shall be reimbursed from the fund for seventy-five19percent (75%) of the certification fee for the initial ten (10) year20certificate. Fees for renewal of the national board certificate are at21the teacher's own expense.

Sec. 12. A national board certified teacher is entitled to receive a stipend from the fund in addition to the teacher's annual compensation for serving as a mentor to teachers within the teacher's school or school corporation in a mentoring program approved by the department.

27 Sec. 13. (a) After June 30, 2014, a school corporation shall 28 provide a public school teacher who has attained national board 29 certification as of July 1, 2014, or thereafter with an annual 30 national board certification salary supplement of two thousand 31 dollars (\$2,000) for the life of the certificate. The salary 32 supplement shall be added to the teacher's base salary and shall be 33 considered in the calculation for contributions to the Indiana state 34 teachers' retirement fund.

(b) If a national board certified teacher ceases to be employed as a classroom teacher or a teacher mentor in the field of the teacher's national certification, the salary supplement under this section ends.

(c) A school corporation is entitled to reimbursement from the fund for salary supplements paid by the school corporation under this section.

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Sec. 14. A school corporation is entitled to reimbursement from



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1 the fund for substitute teacher pay for persons who serve as 2 substitute teachers for teachers who are national board 3 certification candidates while the candidates are on paid released 4 time under section 8 or 9 of this chapter pursuing national board 5 certification. The reimbursement shall be based on the school 6 corporation's salary schedule for substitute teachers.

Sec. 15. The state board shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to
carry out this chapter, including rules under which a school
corporation may establish a mentoring program involving national
board certified teachers. The rules must specify the conditions for
the mentoring program as well as the amount of the stipend that
will be provided to a teacher serving as a mentor.



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
