DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 10-21-1.

Synopsis: School safety grants. Provides that the first \$100,000,000 reverted each state fiscal year, or total reversions if less than \$100,000,000, shall be transferred to the agency settlement fund. Appropriates 25% of the amount transferred for the secured school safety grant program for physical school infrastructure safety related improvements. Appropriates 75% of the amount transferred for school resource officer grants. Requires the grants to be distributed before November 1 each year. Allows grants to be made to any school receiving state funding.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

HOUSE BILL No. 1424

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 10-21-1-4.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2019]: Sec. 4.5. (a) As used in this section, "school" refers to any
4	kindergarten through grade 12 school that receives state funding.
5	(b) At the conclusion of each state fiscal year, the auditor of
6	state shall determine the total amount of money that has reverted
7	to the state general fund during the state fiscal year from any
8	account or fund. Before August 1 each year, the auditor of state
9	shall transfer from the state general fund to the agency settlement
10	fund established by IC 4-12-16-2 the lesser of:
11	(1) one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000); or
12	(2) the total amount of money that has reverted to the state
13	general fund during the previous state fiscal year from any
14	account or fund.
15	(c) There is annually appropriated from the agency settlement
16	fund the following amounts for the following purposes:
17	(1) Twenty-five percent (25%) of the amount transferred

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1	under subsection (b) for the board to provide secured school

24	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 7. The department of homeland security shall
25	report before October 1 of each year to the budget committee
26	concerning matching grants awarded under this chapter during the
27	previous fiscal year.
