DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-43.

Synopsis: School equity grants. Establishes the equity education grants (grant). Provides that a school corporation is eligible to receive a \$2,000 grant per school year for each student who is in the lowest performing ethnic or racial subgroup based on the ILEARN program assessment results for the previous school year and is either: (1) eligible for free or reduced price lunch; or (2) a foster child.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

18	is entitled to receive a grant under this chapter for students that

20	(1) in the lowest performing ethnic or racial subgroup based
21	on the ILEARN program assessment results for the previous
22	school year; and
23	(2) either:
24	(A) eligible for free or reduced price lunch; or
25	(B) a foster child.
26	(b) The amount of the grant a school corporation may receive
27	under this chapter for a particular school year is two thousand
28	dollars (\$2,000) multiplied by the number of students described in
29	subsection (a).
30	Sec. 4. In order to receive a grant under this chapter, the school
31	corporation must submit information prescribed by the
32	department that is necessary for the department to verify the grant

amount under section 3 of this chapter.



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
