A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state and local administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

16	this chapter, that gives preference to eligible broadband projects that
17	meet the following criteria:
18	(1) Projects that will provide eligible broadband service to
19	unincorporated areas in Indiana.
20	(2) Projects for which the applicant commits to providing more
21	than fifty percent (50%) of the cost to deploy the proposed
22	broadband infrastructure. When multiple applicants apply for a
23	grant to provide eligible broadband service to the same rural area,
24	the office may establish a preference for approving applications
25	with a greater funding contribution by the applicant.
26	(3) Projects that involve an agreement between the applicant and
27	one (1) or more other parties that would permit the applicant to
28	use existing facilities or infrastructure owned or controlled by an
29	unrelated third party to enable the applicant to offer eligible
30	broadband service to locations in a rural area.
31	(4) Projects that involve an agreement or committed
32	partnership between an eligible broadband service provider
33	and a local unit of government or other locally based entity.
34	(f) (e) The procedures established under this section must prohibit
35	a state agency, in awarding any grant from the fund, from
36	discriminating between different types of technology used to provide
37	eligible broadband service in connection with proposed eligible
38	broadband projects.
39	(g) (f) The procedures established under this section must, subject
40	to section 14 of this chapter, require the office to publish on the office's
41	Internet web site all grant applications received by the office under this
