DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-34-4.5; IC 34-30-2-85.6.

Synopsis: School bus drivers and emergency medication. Allows a school bus driver to administer emergency stock medication to: (1) a student at the school; (2) a school employee; or (3) a visitor at the school; if the school bus driver has been trained by a health care provider to recognize a life threatening emergency and properly administer emergency medication.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

HOUSE BILL No. 1429

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 20-34-4.5-0.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 0.7. As used in this chapter,
"school bus driver" has the meaning set forth in IC 20-27-2-9.
SECTION 2. IC 20-34-4.5-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.117-2017,
SECTION 9, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 2. (a) A school nurse may administer emergency
stock medication obtained under section 1 of this chapter to any of the
following individuals if the individual is demonstrating signs or symptoms of a life-threatening emergency and the individual does not
have emergency medication at the school or the individual's
prescription is not available:
(1) Students at the school.
(2) School employees.
(3) Visitors at the school.

(b) School employees and school bus drivers may administer

emergency stock medication obtained under section 1 of this chapter
