Synopsis: Alcoholic beverage dealer residency. Eliminates the Indiana residency requirements for holding an alcoholic beverage dealer's permit.

HOUSE BILL No. 1431

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

17	issue a beer dealer's permit under subsection (c) for the premises of a
