ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1438

DIGEST OF HB 1438 (Updated March 23, 2015 2:19 pm - DI 116)

Citations Affected: IC 20-24.

Synopsis: Adult high schools. Provides that the department of education shall distribute funding for adult high schools to the adult high school's organizer.

Effective: Upon passage.

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(SENATE SPONSORS — KRUSE, YODER, RAATZ, STOOPS, RANDOLPH)

January 14, 2015, read first time and referred to Committee on Education. January 20, 2015, amended, reported — Do Pass. January 22, 2015, read second time, ordered engrossed. Engrossed. January 26, 2015, read third time, passed. Yeas 96, nays 0.

SENATE ACTION February 24, 2015, read first time and referred to Committee on Education & Career Development. March 19, 2015, reported favorably — Do Pass. March 23, 2015, read second time, amended, ordered engrossed.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1438

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-24-7-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.35-2014,
2	SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 1. (a) The organizer is the fiscal agent for the
4	charter school.
5	(b) The organizer has exclusive control of:
6	(1) funds received by the charter school; and
7	(2) financial matters of the charter school.
8	(c) The organizer shall maintain accounts of all funds received and
9	disbursed by the organizer. The organizer shall maintain separate
0	accountings of all funds received and disbursed by each charter school
1	it holds.
12	(d) Notwithstanding IC 20-43, an organizer that operates more than
13	one (1) charter school may file, before July 1, 2014, July 1 of each
4	year, a notice with the department that the organizer desires to receive
15	the tuition support distributions, and in the case of an adult high

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1 school (as defined in IC 20-24-1-2.3), funding provided in the state 2 biennial budget for adult high schools, for the state fiscal year 3 beginning July 1, 2014, for all the charter schools the organizer 4 operates. After the organizer's authorizer or authorizers verify to the 5 department that the organizer operates the charter schools, the 6 department shall distribute the tuition support, and in the case of an adult high school (as defined in IC 20-24-1-2.3), funding provided 7 8 in the state biennial budget for adult high schools, for the verified 9 charter schools to the organizer. The organizer may distribute the tuition support distribution it receives to each charter school it operates 10 11 in the amounts determined by the organizer. However, an organizer that receives money from the state under this subsection may not use any of 12 13 the money received for expenses incurred outside Indiana that are not 14 directly related to the charter school the organizer operates in Indiana.

15 (e) Organizers receiving tuition support under this section may submit a consolidated audit in accordance with guidelines established 16 17 by the state examiner and submit any required financial reporting to the 18 department in a manner prescribed by the state examiner. The state 19 examiner shall establish guidelines and prescribe reporting requirements for organizers under this section that are consistent with 20 21 generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) and the needs of the 22 department.

SECTION 2. IC 20-24-7-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.205-2013, 23 24 SECTION 229, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS 25 [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 2. (a) Not later than each of the dates established by the department for determining ADM under 26 27 IC 20-43-4-3, the organizer shall submit to the department the following information on a form prescribed by the department: 28 29

(1) The number of students enrolled in the charter school.

30 (2) The name and address of each student.

31 (3) The name of the school corporation in which the student has 32 legal settlement.

33 (4) The name of the school corporation, if any, that the student 34 attended during the immediately preceding school year.

35 (5) The grade level in which the student will enroll in the charter 36 school. 37

The department shall verify the accuracy of the information reported.

38 (b) The department shall distribute state tuition support 39 distributions, and in the case of an adult high school (as defined in 40 IC 20-24-1-2.3), funding provided in the state biennial budget for adult high schools, to the organizer. The department shall make a 41 42 distribution under this subsection at the same time and in the same

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- manner as the department makes a distribution of state tuition support under IC 20-43-2 to other school corporations. SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.
