HOUSE BILL No. 1463

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 14-27-7-6; IC 14-28-1-8.

Synopsis: Flood control measures. Provides that immediate action may be taken for the maintenance, alteration, repair, reconstruction, change in construction or location, or removal of a dike, floodwall, levee, or appurtenance to provide emergency protection to: (1) human life; or (2) property; if, in the opinion of the department of natural resources (DNR), there is not sufficient time for the maintenance, alteration, repair, reconstruction, change in construction or location, or removal to be effected through the issuance and enforcement of a notice of violation. (Under current law, danger to property alone is not sufficient cause for immediate action.) Provides that if, in the opinion of the DNR, immediate action is necessary, the DNR may: (1) undertake the action by itself or through a contractor engaged by the DNR; or (2) authorize the owner of the property on which the dike, floodwall, levee, or appurtenance is located to undertake the action. Provides that, before the natural resources commission or its agents may enter private property to investigate for flood control purposes, the owner or occupant of the property must be contacted and informed of the reason for the entry and the intended time and place of the entry by: (1) direct, in person verbal communication; (2) a telephone call; (3) certified mail with return receipt requested; or (4) first class mail or electronic mail followed by a response from the owner or occupant of the property; except when there is a need to enter the property immediately because of an emergency.

HOUSE BILL No. 1463

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 14-27-7-6 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 6. (a) If at any time the condition of a levee, a dike, a floodwall, or an appurtenance becomes so dangerous to the safety of **human** life and or property that, in the opinion of the department, there is not sufficient time for the issuance and enforcement of a notice of violation for the maintenance, alteration, repair, reconstruction, change in construction or location, or removal of the dike, floodwall, levee, or appurtenance in the manner provided in this chapter, the department may immediately take the measures that are essential to provide emergency protection to:

11 **(1) human** life;

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- (2) property; or
 - (3) both human life and property.

14 (b) The measures that the department may take under 15 subsection (a) include:

(1) undertaking the maintenance, alteration, repair, reconstruction, change in construction or location, or removal



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1 of the dike, floodwall, levee, or appurtenance: 2 (A) by itself; or 3 (B) through a contractor engaged by the department; or 4 (2) authorizing the owner of the property on which the dike, 5 floodwall, levee, or appurtenance is located to undertake the 6 maintenance, alteration, repair, reconstruction, change in 7 construction or location, or removal of the dike, floodwall, 8 levee, or appurtenance. 9 (b) (c) The department may recover the cost of the emergency 10 measures taken by the department under subsection (b)(1) from the 11 owner by appropriate legal action. 12 SECTION 2. IC 14-28-1-8 IS AMENDED TO READ AS 13 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 8. (a) The commission and the commission's agents, engineers, surveyors, and other 14 15 employees may enter upon any land or water in Indiana for the purpose of making an investigation, an examination, or a survey provided by 16 17 this chapter. 18 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), before an entry upon 19 the property under subsection (a), communication with the owner 20 or occupant of the parcel of property concerning the reason for the 21 entry and the intended time and place of the entry must occur in 22 one (1) of the following forms: 23 (1) Direct verbal communication to the owner or occupant in 24 person at least twenty-four (24) hours before the parcel of 25 property is entered. 26 (2) A telephone call to the owner or occupant at least 27 twenty-four (24) hours before the parcel of property is 28 entered. 29 (3) Certified mail with return receipt requested that is sent to 30 and received by the owner or occupant at least forty-eight (48) 31 hours before the parcel of property is entered. 32 (4) Notification by: 33 (A) first class mail that is delivered to the owner or 34 occupant at least twenty-four (24) hours before the parcel 35 of property is entered; or 36 (B) electronic mail that is sent to the owner or occupant at 37 least twenty-four (24) hours before the parcel of property 38 is entered; 39 followed, before the entry upon the property, by a response 40 from the owner or occupant by direct verbal communication 41 in person, a telephone call, or an electronic mail response in which the owner or occupant acknowledges awareness of the 42

2 (c) Communication with the owner or occupant under
3 subsection (b) before property is entered is not required if there is
4 a need to enter the property under subsection (a) immediately
5 because of an emergency such as the possible failure of a dike,
6 floodwall, or levee due to flooding.
