DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-4-9.7-9.

Synopsis: Grants for refugee assistance organizations. Provides that the office of community and rural affairs may use money in the rural economic development fund to provide grants to nonprofit organizations that assist in refugee resettlement and receive federal funds to assist in refugee resettlement.

HOUSE BILL No. 1493

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 4-4-9.7-9, AS AMENDED BY P.L.177-2018
SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 9. (a) The rural economic development fund is
established for the purpose of enhancing and developing rura
communities and providing grants to nonprofit organizations that
assist in refugee resettlement. The fund shall be administered by the
office.

- (b) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from the money in the fund.
- (c) Notwithstanding IC 5-13, the treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund under IC 5-10.3-5. The treasurer of state may contract with investment management professionals, investment advisers, and legal counsel to assist in the management of the fund and may pay the state expenses incurred under those contracts.
- (d) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund.

2	(1) To create, assess, and assist a pilot project to enhance the
2	economic and community development in a rural area.
4	(2) To establish a local revolving loan fund for:
5	(A) an industrial;

10	(3) To provide a loan for an economic development project in a

18	(8) To provide funding for rural economic development projects

20	(A) Infrastructure, including water, wastewater, and storm
21	water infrastructure needs.
22	(B) Housing.
23	(C) Health care.

26	(F) Other rural economic development issues, as determined
27	by the office.
28	(9) To provide funding for the establishment of new regional rural
29	development groups and the operation of existing regional rural
30	development groups.
31	(10) To provide grants to nonprofit organizations that:
32	(A) assist in refugee resettlement; and
33	(B) receive federal funds to assist in refugee resettlement.
34	(f) Expenditures from the fund are subject to appropriation by the
35	general assembly and approval by the office.
