## HOUSE BILL No. 1522

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-7-2-135.7; IC 12-17.2-8.

**Synopsis:** Children's overnight camps. Defines "overnight camp". Provides that the division of family resources (division) shall license and monitor overnight camps, including ensuring that a national criminal history background check is completed before granting a license to an applicant desiring to conduct an overnight camp or to an employee or volunteer of the applicant who has direct contact with a child participating in a program offered by the applicant. Authorizes the division to charge a fee for a license application and renewal and to adopt rules concerning the licensing and inspection of overnight camps.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

Chapter 8. Overnight Camps

10Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "overnight camp" means any11area or tract of land established, operated, or maintained to12provide more than seventy-two (72) continuous hours of outdoor13group living experiences away from established residences for:

- 14 (1) educational;
- 15 (2) recreational;
- 16 (3) sectarian; or
- 17 (4) health purposes;

21	concerning the licensing and inspection of overnight camps after
22	consultation with the following:
23	(1) State department of health.
24	(2) Fire prevention and building safety commission.
25	(b) The rules adopted under subsection (a) shall be applied by
26	the division and state fire marshal in the licensing and inspection
27	of applicants for a license and licensees under this article.
