ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1528

DIGEST OF HB 1528 (Updated April 10, 2023 2:19 pm - DI 110)

Citations Affected: IC 21-12.

Synopsis: Next generation Hoosier educators scholarship program. Provides that an individual enrolled in a transition to teaching program may apply for a one time scholarship under the next generation Hoosier educators scholarship program. Establishes requirements to qualify for the one time scholarship. Provides that the maximum amount of a scholarship is \$10,000. Provides that the total annual amount of scholarships awarded from the next generation Hoosier educators scholarship fund to individuals enrolled in a transition to teaching program may not exceed \$1,000,000. Requires that an awarded scholarship must be repaid under certain conditions.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1528

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

6 a scholarship, an applicant must:

3 amount that an individual is required to repay shall be reduced by
4 twenty percent (20%), as determined by the commission, for each
5 consecutive year the individual teaches at a public school or eligible
6 school (as defined in IC 20-51-1-4.7).

7 (b) The commission may extend the length of time in which an
8 individual must complete the requirements of an agreement described
9 in section 5(a)(5) **or 5.5(4)** of this chapter if the individual submits a
10 petition to the commission in a manner prescribed by the commission
11 and the commission makes a determination that extenuating
12 circumstances, as determined by the commission, prevented the
13 individual from timely meeting the requirements described in section
14 5(a)(5) **or 5.5(4)** of this chapter, **as applicable**.

16 the individual has been declared to be totally and permanently disabled
17 under 34 CFR 685.213.
