DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 36-8.

Synopsis: Residency of public safety officers. Provides that a city or town (municipality) may adopt an ordinance requiring a member of the police or fire department (department) to reside within the municipality within a period of time specified in the ordinance, but not sooner than six months after the date the ordinance is adopted or the member is hired by the department.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

HOUSE BILL No. 1533

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 36-8-4-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.65-2008,

2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b)
4	through (f), members of the police and fire departments must reside
5	in Indiana within:
6	(1) the county in which the city is located; or
7	(2) a county that is contiguous to the county in which the city is
8	located.
9	(b) A city may adopt an ordinance that requires a member of
10	the city's police or fire department to reside within the city. The
11	ordinance may require a member to reside within the city within
12	a specified time period after:
13	(1) the ordinance is adopted; or
14	(2) the member is hired by the police or fire department;
15	or lose the member's eligibility to remain a member of the city's
16	police or fire department. However, the member may not be
17	required to reside within the city less than six (6) months after the

3	(b) (c) In a consolidated city, a member who was residing outside
4	the county on January 1, 1975, is exempt from subsection (a).
5	(c) (d) A city with a population of less than seven thousand five
6	hundred (7,500) may adopt an ordinance that requires a member of the
7	city's police or fire department to comply with the following:
8	(1) Reside within the county in which the city is located.
9	(2) Have adequate means of transportation into the city.
10	(3) Maintain in the member's residence telephone service with the
11	city.
12	(d) (e) This subsection applies to a city that:
13	(1) has a population of less than seven thousand five hundred
14	(7,500); and
15	(2) adopted an ordinance to establish the requirements described
16	in this subsection before September 1, 1984.
17	A city may require, in addition to the requirements of subsection (c)
18	(d), that a member of the police or fire department reside within the
19	city until the member has served in the department for five (5) years.

21	or described in subsection (d)(2) (e)(2) may not require a member of

23	the city is located if the member resides outside the county on the date

30	(1) the county in which the town is located; or
31	(2) a county that is contiguous to the county in which the town is
32	located.
33	(b) A town may adopt an ordinance that requires a member of
34	the town's police or fire department to reside within the town. The
35	ordinance may require a member to reside within the town within
36	a specified time period after:
37	(1) the ordinance is adopted; or
38	(2) the member is hired by the police or fire department;
39	or lose the member's eligibility to remain a member of the town's
40	police or fire department. However, the member may not be
41	required to reside within the town less than six (6) months after the
42	date the ordinance is adopted or the member is hired by the
