## **HOUSE BILL No. 1542**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 12-8-1.5-19; IC 12-15; IC 12-21-2-10; IC 25-23.6-2-6.

**Synopsis:** Mental health and addiction services. Requires that the office of the secretary of family and social services prepare and submit a report that: (1) identifies certain administrative and reporting requirements that are unnecessary or overly burdensome; and (2) makes recommendations. Requires the office of Medicaid policy and planning to include a clinical social worker, mental health counselor, and marriage and family therapist as eligible providers for the supervision of a plan of treatment for a patient's outpatient mental health or substance abuse treatment services, if the supervision is in the provider's scope of practice, education, and training. Provides that a managed care organization may not require a licensed psychiatrist to be certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology for purposes of credentialing or contracting with the psychiatrist while the psychiatrist is practicing at a community mental health center. Prohibits the division of mental health and addiction from implementing certain federal regulations concerning home and community based standards before the final date required by the United States Department of Health and Human Services to implement the regulation. Requires the behavioral health and human services licensing board to meet monthly.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1542**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 12-8-1.5-19 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
1, 2019]: Sec. 19. (a) Before October 1, 2019, the office of the
secretary of family and social services shall prepare and submit a
report as described in subsection (b) to the legislative council in an
electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
(b) The office of the secretary shall conduct a comprehensive
study of the health programs that the office of the secretary
administers or oversees, including programs administered by
managed care programs under IC 12-15-12 and programs
contracted with the office of Medicaid policy and planning. The
report must:
(1) identify administrative and reporting requirements by
health providers under contract with the office of the
secretary that are unnecessary or overly burdensome; and

(2) include recommendations for reductions in administrative

burdens related to the administration and oversight described

3	SECTION 2. IC 12-15-5-14, AS AMENDED BY P.L.129-2018,
4	SECTION 5, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

26	(3) Substance abuse treatment.
27	(4) Primary care services.
28	(5) Evaluation and management services for inpatient or
29	outpatient psychiatric treatment.
30	(6) Prescription drugs.
31	(d) The office shall include an advanced practice registered nurse,
32	a clinical social worker, a mental health counselor, and a marriage
33	and family therapist as an eligible provider providers for the
34	supervision of a plan of treatment for a patient's outpatient mental
35	health or substance abuse treatment services, if the supervision is in the
36	advanced practice registered nurse's, scope of practice, education, and
37	training of the advanced practice registered nurse, clinical social
38	worker, mental health counselor, or marriage and family therapist.
39	(e) This section:
40	(1) may not be construed to expand an advanced practice
41	registered nurse's, the scope of practice of an advanced practice

9	may not require a psychiatrist who is licensed under IC 25-22.5 to
10	be certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology
11	for purposes of credentialing or contracting with the psychiatris
12	while the psychiatrist is practicing at a community mental health
13	center.
14	SECTION 4. IC 12-21-2-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
15	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
16	1, 2019]: Sec. 10. (a) The division may not implement any federa
17	regulation that:
18	(1) is adopted by the United States Department of Health and
19	Human Services under 42 CFR Parts 430, 431, 435, 436, 440
20	441, or 447; and
21	(2) concerns home and community based standards;
22	before the final date required by the United States Department of
23	Health and Human Services to implement the regulation.
24	(b) Nothing in this section prohibits the division from adopting
25	rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement the federal home and
26	community based standards, if the rule is not enforced before the
27	final date required by the United States Department of Health and
28	Human Services to implement the regulation.
29	(c) This section expires July 1, 2021.
30	SECTION 5. IC 25-23.6-2-6 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
31	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 6. The board shall mee
32	at least one (1) time each year. monthly.

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
